House Bill 337 Sponsor Statement

“An Act relating to the Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers, and Land Surveyors and to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development.”

HB 337 revises the statutes governing architects, engineers, and land surveyors in the State of Alaska, designating an investigator to serve specifically for the Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers, and Land Surveyors (AELS).

At the present time, one investigator serves part-time on the AELS Board while serving on five other Boards. The oversight for this one individual includes approximately 20,000 licensees. Recently, the AELS Board voted to expand the number of branches of licensure for engineers from the existing 6 branches to 16. This expansion will ensure inclusion of professions not currently regulated by the Board. The reason for the branch increase is to ensure the safety of Alaskans who work in these engineering professions (i.e. structural, environmental, nuclear, and industrial). As a result, the increase in branches could increase considerably the number of licensees that this one investigator would serve.

While the workload of the investigator increases, so must his knowledge of the applicable statutes and regulations for the various boards. Hiring a full-time investigator would help to ensure efficiency and effectiveness of the AELS Board; thereby protecting the State of Alaska from risk hazards in public health, safety, and welfare. HB 337 opens an avenue for the AELS Board to maintain proper oversight of the licensees and to ensure compliance with State Statutes and Regulations.
