FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

House Bill 282 relates to municipal regulation of automated traffic safety cameras. The bill amends Alaska Statute 29.10.200 and adds a new section under Alaska Statute 29.35 to reserve authority to regulate automated traffic safety cameras to the state and to prohibit municipalities from banning their use unless otherwise authorized by statute. The bill applies to both home rule and general law municipalities and provides a definition of an automated traffic safety camera.

As introduced, the bill does not designate a state agency to regulate automated traffic safety cameras, does not require the development of regulations, and does not establish a statewide program or enforcement framework. The legislation does not assign any new duties or responsibilities to the Department of Public Safety, including the Alaska State Troopers or any other division within the department.

The department does not anticipate an increase in workload, staffing, or operating costs as a result of this legislation. Any potential cases arising under existing law can be absorbed within existing resources. There is no fiscal impact anticipated to the Department of Public Safety.

If the bill is amended to identify the Department of Public Safety as the agency responsible for regulating automated traffic safety cameras, including promulgation of regulations or program administration, the fiscal impact to the department would need to be reevaluated and this fiscal note could change accordingly.
