Dear Members of the House State Affairs Committee,

I am Sally Donaldson, retired school counselor, residing in Juneau, Alaska, just up the hill from the Capitol building. I write in favor of HB250.

Thank you for hearing HB250, making it a crime for a city, state or federal peace officer to wear a mask in public. We know from reports from other states that peace officers who wear masks can escalate situations in which their job is to keep calm and order. Peace officers are typically trained to de-escalate potentially violent situations. Concealing their faces does just the opposite, obscuring nonverbal communication.

Several states and municipalities are currently considering or have passed legislation such as HB250 in order to prevent unnecessary fear and escalation of violent behavior.

I often attend peaceful, legal gatherings, and never have felt afraid. It is my legal right to express my opinions. Imagine how you might feel if you encountered a group of masked, armed, unidentified individuals at such gatherings. I can say right now that I would feel terror.
