Amend section 14(a), Office of the Governor, to read:

(a) The sum of \$20,701,535 is appropriated from federal economic stimulus funds received by the state under P.L. 111-5 (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009) to the Office of the Governor <u>for deposit into the major maintenance grant fund (AS 14.11.007) and allocated as shown for purposes consistent with sec. 14002(b), P.L. 111-5:</u>

Economic Stimulus funding may be used for these capital projects. This amendment replaces the use of this portion of the State Fiscal Stabilization Fund.

CSSB 75 could be amended by reducing the amount for the St. Mary's project from \$3,306,502 by \$412,347 down to \$2,894,155. The remaining four projects listed above could be deleted in their entirety from CSSB 75.

Amend section 14(b), Office of the Governor, to read:

(b) The sum of \$93,043,200 is appropriated from federal economic stimulus funds received by the state under P.L. 111-5 (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009) to the Office of the Governor <u>for deposit into the public education fund (AS 14.17.300)</u> [TO BE DISTRIBUTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND EARLY DEVELOPMENT] for purposes consistent with sec. 14002(a), P.L. 111-5.

This amendment replaces the use of this portion of the State Fiscal Stabilization Fund by depositing the \$93 million into the public education fund. The FY10 increase in education funding of \$56,491,600 would come from the federal economic stimulus funds and \$36,551,600, a portion of the FY2011 increase of \$57.7 million, would come from the federal economic stimulus funds.

Conceptual amendment 1 to HB 199 to adjust FY10 and FY11 funding via the FY11 deposit to the public education fund:

Sec. --. CONSTITUTIONAL BUDGET RESERVE. The appropriation of \$1,111,914,700 from the budget reserve fund (art. IX, sec. 17, Constitution of the State of Alaska) to the public education fund (AS 14.17.300) in the version of HB 81, Twenty-Sixth Alaska State Legislature, that is enacted into law is reduced by \$93,043,200 to a new total of \$1,018,871,500.

Amend sec. 15, Contingency, by adding a new subsection to read:

(b) The appropriation reduction made in sec. -- of this Act is contingent on passage by the Twenty-Sixth Alaska State Legislature in the First Regular Session and enactment into law of a version of HB 81 that appropriates not less than \$1,111,914,700 from the budget reserve fund (art. IX, sec. 17, Constitution of the State of Alaska) to the public education fund (AS 14.17.300).

Conceptual amendment 1 needs a July 1, 2009 effective date.

(r) The sum of \$947,608,400 [\$1,004,100,000] is appropriated from the general fund to the public education fund (AS 14.17.300).

Economic Stimulus funding may be used for these capital projects. This amendment transfers Economic Stimulus funds from the operating to the capital section of HB 199.

CSSB 75 could be amended to delete the appropriations for Crime Laboratory Equipment Replacement, \$50,000; AST Law Enforcement Equipment Replacement, \$250,000; AWT Law Enforcement Equipment Replacement, \$200,000; and reduce the appropriation for AST Mobile Data Computers – Phase II by \$154,100 from \$240,000 to \$85,900.

Amend section 12, Department of Health and Social Services, by adding a new subsection to read:

(c) The general fund appropriation to the Department of Health and Social Services, public assistance, child care benefits, in the version of HB 81 that is passed by the Twenty-Sixth Alaska State Legislature and enacted into law, is reduced by \$1,500,000, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

Amend sec. 15, Contingency, by adding a new subsection to read:

(--) The appropriation reduction made in sec. 12(c) of this Act is contingent on passage by the Twenty-Sixth Alaska State Legislature in the First Regular Session and enactment into law of a version of HB 81 that allocates not less than \$50,229,100 to the Department of Health and Social Services, public assistance, child care benefits,

These amendments need a July 1, 2009 effective date.

Economic Stimulus funding is used to replace the general fund increase in the child care benefits FY2010 operating budget.
