FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act declaring a state energy policy."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 44.99 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 44.99.115. Declaration of state energy policy. The State of Alaska recognizes that the state's economic prosperity is dependent on available, reliable, and affordable residential, commercial, and industrial energy supplies. The state also recognizes that worldwide supply and demand for fossil fuels and concerns about global climate change will affect the price of fossil fuels consumed by Alaskans and exported from the state to other markets. Therefore, it is the policy of the state to

- (1) institute a comprehensive and coordinated approach to supporting energy efficiency and conservation by
 - (A) pursuing, promoting, and rewarding energy efficiency and conservation;
 - (B) promoting statewide energy efficiency codes for new and renovated residential, commercial, and public buildings;
