Agenda Item 21 - Regulation Update/status of pending Regulation Projects

A. Regulations to approve for public notice, 12 AAC 36.100, .105 - Comity Regulations.

The rewrite of the proposed changes to the comity regulations is not yet ready for public notice. The Executive Administrator will work with the committee on the rewrite and will have a final product for the board at the November 2007 meeting.

B. Regulations to be Adopted, 12 AAC 36.500 - .550 - Continuing E ducation for Architects, Engineers and Landscape Architects.
