A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act stating a public policy that allows a person to choose or decline any mode of securing health care services."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to read:

SHORT TITLE. This Act may be known as the Alaska Health Freedom Act.

* Sec. 2. AS 44.99 is amended by adding a new section to article 2 to read:

Sec. 44.99.130. Declaration of policy for securing health care services. (a) It is the policy of the State of Alaska that a person has the right to and may choose or decline any mode of obtaining health care services without penalty or threat of penalty.

- (b) The policy stated in (a) of this section
- (1) does not apply to health care services provided or required by the state, a political subdivision of the state, or a court of the state; and

- (2) may not impair a contract right that provides health care services.
- (c) In this section,
- (1) "health care services" means a service or treatment, or provision of a product, for the care of a physical or mental disease, illness, injury, defect, or condition, or to maintain or improve physical or mental health;
- (2) "mode of obtaining" means directly purchasing health care services from a health care provider purchasing insurance covering health care services;
- (3) "penalty" means a fine, tax, surcharge, fee, or other monetary charge.
