Report to the House Judiciary on HB 149

Presented by:
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Deputy Attorney General

In 2006 the Alaska State Legislature passed significant legislation addressing the methamphetamine problem in Alaska. This legislation was in House Bill 149 and became law on June 30, 2006 in 53 SLA 2006. The legislation did the following (with yellow highlights being specific to methamphetamine):

Manslaughter, Methamphetamine, and Marijuana

This legislation amended the manslaughter statute by adding the prohibition of knowingly manufacturing or delivering a controlled substance in violation of AS 11.71.010 – 11.71.030, or in violation of 11.71.040(a)(1) for schedule IVA controlled substances, if a person dies as a direct result of ingestion of the controlled substance. The statute provides that the death is a result that does not require a culpable mental state. Ingestion is defined as voluntarily or involuntarily taking a substance into the body in any manner.

The legislation amended second-degree misconduct involving a controlled substance to prohibit a person from

- (1) possessing methamphetamine (meth) in an organic solution with intent to extract from it meth or its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers;
- (2) delivering an immediate precursor of meth, or its salts, etc., to another with reckless disregard that the precursor will be used to manufacture any material, mixture, etc. that contains meth or its salts, isomers, etc.;
- (3) delivering a listed chemical (listed in AS 11.71.200) to another with reckless disregard that the chemical will be used to manufacture any material that contains meth, an immediate precursor to meth, or meth in an organic solution.

The bill also amended second-degree misconduct involving a controlled substance to provide that in a prosecution for manufacture, delivery, or possession with intent to manufacture or deliver meth, the possession of more than six grams of certain listed chemicals (ephedrine, etc.) is prima facie evidence that the person intended to use the chemical to manufacture or deliver to another to manufacture meth. This evidentiary presumption does not apply to a person who possesses a listed chemical under a valid prescription or as part of a legitimate business such as a pharmacist, retailer, and so on. It also does not apply to possession of less than 24 grams of certain listed chemicals at a school, camp, lodge, or similar place where a larger supply of the substances may be needed.

The legislation amended misconduct involving controlled substances in the fourth degree, AS 11.71.040(a)(3)(F), by prohibiting possession of an aggregate of four ounces or more of a schedule VIA controlled substance (marijuana). This is a class C felony.

AS 11.71.050(a)(1) was amended to provide that it is fifth-degree misconduct involving a controlled substance to manufacture, deliver, or possess with the intent to deliver or manufacture a substance having an aggregate weight of less than one ounce of a schedule VIA controlled substance. Repealed from this statute was the prohibition of manufacture, delivery, or possession with intent to manufacture or deliver an aggregate weight of less than one-half ounce containing a schedule VIA substance.

AS 11.71.050(a)(3) (misconduct involving a controlled substance in the fifth degree) was amended to prohibit the possession of one ounce or more (reduced from former one-half pound) of a schedule VIA substance. This conduct is a class A misdemeanor.

AS 11.71.060(a) was amended to prohibit the possession of less than one ounce of a schedule VIA substance. This conduct is a class B misdemeanor. Also amended was the method to measure the weight of live marijuana plants in AS 11.71.080.

The bill created a new crime that prohibits a person from purchasing or receiving more than six grams of certain listed chemicals, such as ephedrine, in any 30-day period. It excepted certain conduct, such as purchase under a valid prescription, and possession by various types of legitimate businesses such as a pharmacy. Additionally, a school, camp, day care center, and similar institutions may purchase or receive up to 24 grams of the listed substances. Violation of the new offense is a class C felony.

The new law also amended Schedule VA controlled substances to include anabolic steroids, and adopted a list of anabolic steroids. It did not include as a controlled substance anabolic steroids intended for use to implant cattle or other nonhuman species that have been approved by the federal government.

The bill amended AS 12.30.023, release before trial in cases involving controlled substances or alcohol. It provides that the court must impose a minimum of \$250,000 cash bond on a person charged with manufacture of meth in violation of AS 11.71.020(a)(2), if the person has a prior conviction for manufacture, delivery, or possession of meth. The court may avoid mandatory bail if the person shows that his or her role was that

of an aider or abettor and he or she would not benefit financially from the charged offense.¹

The bill made changes in sentencing ranges for a person convicted of manufacturing meth. For example, a person convicted of a class A felony for manufacture of meth in violation of AS 11.71.020(a)(2)(A) or (B) would be subject to a seven to 11 year sentencing range if the manufacture occurred in a building and the defendant acted with reckless disregard that the building was used as a home for one or more children under 18 years old, the defendant used one or more child to help in the manufacture of meth, or one or more child was present during the manufacture of meth.

AS 12.55.135 was amended to add a section that addresses sentences for possession of marijuana in violation of AS 11.71.060, misconduct involving a controlled substance in the sixth degree. It provides that a court may not impose a term of imprisonment for the violation if the defendant was not on formal or informal probation or parole, the defendant possessed the marijuana for personal use within his or her permanent or temporary residence, and the defendant has not been previously convicted for possession of marijuana either in Alaska or another jurisdiction. It sets a maximum unsuspended fine for a first offense at \$500, and \$1,000 if the person has a previous conviction.

The law also prohibits sale of ephedrine and similar products to a person under 16 years of age, and similarly prohibits purchase of these products by a person under 16.

The bill amended AS 17.30 by adding a new section that requires a seller, retailer, or vendor to follow P.L. 109-177, 120 Stat. 192, with regard to amounts, identification, storage, access and availability, and logbooks for the sale of precursors to meth. Law enforcement officers have access to the logbooks, and the retailer, etc. must train all employees and agents in the requirements of federal law.

A person subject to the requirements of federal law under this section does not violate the law if the person can establish by a preponderance of evidence that the person exercised reasonable care in ensuring compliance with the law. The penalty for violation of the federal requirements is a civil fine of not more than \$10,000 for each violation.

Statistical analysis is difficult in criminal matters in that different agencies keep information in different formats; and, although probably better than confidential reporting, the methods are still subjective. For example, what constitutes a “drop site” — that is where a person has disposed of materials used in manufacturing

methamphetamine — is subjective. To one law enforcement agency five empty boxes of ephedrine may be a drop site, where another agency would require the presence of more chemicals like phosphorous to be considered a drop site. Nonetheless the following numbers may be of assistance.

Table 1 are seizures for each of the states for the last nine years.

Table 2 though 10 are a breakdown of each state on a yearly basis starting in 2000 and ending in 2009.

Charts 1 and 2 are charts of the same information, chart 1 being all states and chart 2 being Alaska.

Table 11 is a breakdown of court filings under AS 11.71.020. AS11.71.020 is the only statute that contains separate meth specific provisions rather than just referring to the class of drugs such as a schedule 1A or 11A controlled substance.

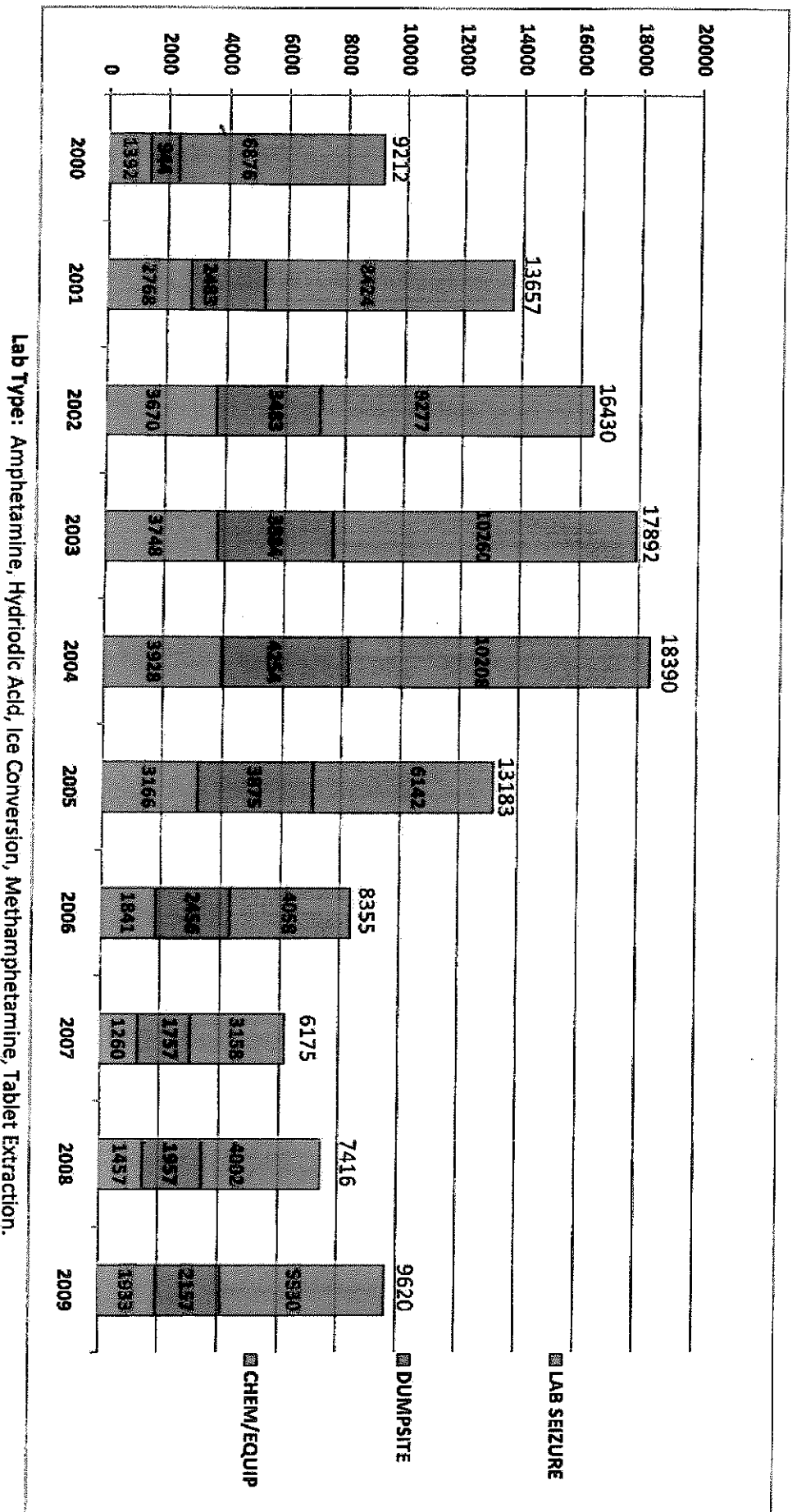

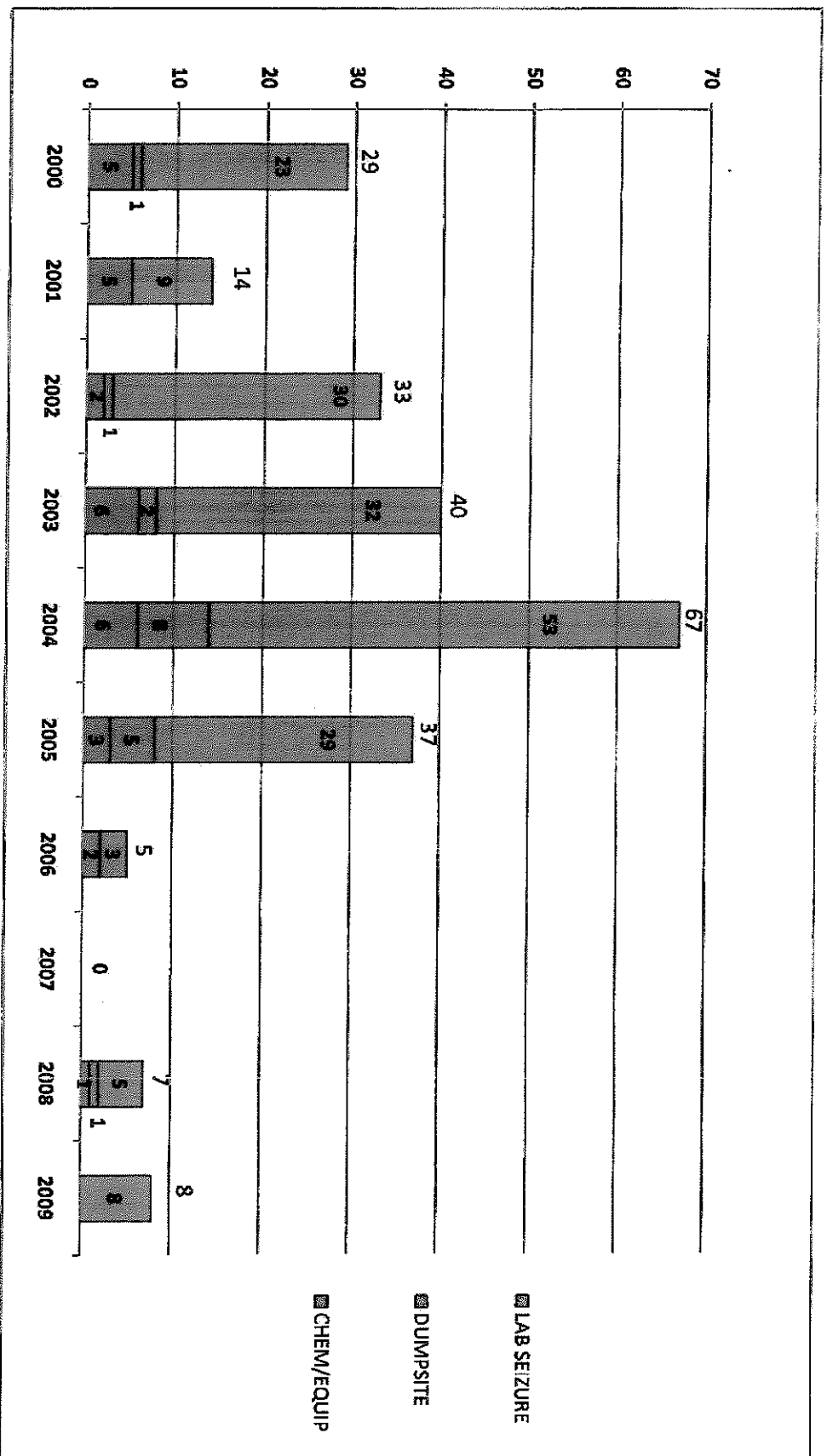
