A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act requiring a study of the health effects of airport security screening."

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- * Section 1. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section
 to read:
- 5 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES; STUDY OF AIRPORT
- 6 SCREENING HEALTH EFFECTS. (a) The Department of Health and Social Services shall
- 7 conduct a study of the mental and physical health effects of airport security screening. The
- 8 study shall investigate the potential for
- 9 (1) psychological trauma to travelers who have
- 10 (A) been diagnosed with cancer;
- (B) had surgical resection or implant of a body part;
- 12 (C) been the victim of a physical or sexual assault; or
- 13 (D) sustained an injury related to work or war;
- 14 (2) physical effects from radiologic or other techniques used in the screening;

- (b) The department may enter into a contract with a qualified entity to conduct the study described in (a) of this section.
- (c) On or before January 1, 2014, the department shall report the findings of the study conducted under this section to the legislative committees having jurisdiction over health matters.
