## FISCAL NOTE

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BILL NO. HB351

### Analysis

This bill establishes procedures relating to the issuance, suspension, and revocation of certification of police officers by the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC); makes court services officers subject to certification by the APSC; makes confidential certain information that personally identifies a police officer; and prohibits public employers of police officers from requiring police officer applicants or employees to submit to a lie detector test.

The potential fiscal impact to the Department of Public Safety (DPS) relates to the portion of this bill that includes court services officers in the definition of "police officer" and, in so doing, subjects court services officers to the training requirements under AS 18.65.240.

To fulfill this training requirement, each of DPS' fifty-nine court services officers would be required to attend the 15-week Alaska Law Enforcement Training program held at the Public Safety Academy in Sitka, Alaska. The cost to DPS for each participant is \$11,500.

To minimize impact to the Bureau of Judicial Services, it is envisioned that half (30) of the court services officers would attend training in FY 2013 and the other half (29) would attend training in FY 2014.
