History of GCCC

- February 2003: SB65 by Senator Lyda Green was introduced as a funding mechanism to expand correctional facilities within the state. SB65 mandates local (borough) governments to bond for construction of a prison.
- May 2004: SB65 passes unanimously
- June 2006: Site selection process begins with a plan to construct a 2,250 bed facility in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough
- June 2008: Conception of facility structure is established—to construct a medium security facility with a Special Management Unit. Total bed capacity = 1,536
- April 2009: Construction of GCCC begins

GCCC at a Glance

- 435,000 square feet of buildings on a cleared perimeter of 90 acres within a 330 acre site
- Double-fenced perimeter with a total of 1,536 beds, of which:
 - 1,280 General Housing
 - 128 Special Management Unit
 - 56 Administrative Segregation
 - 56 Punitive Segregation
 - 16 Medical Segregation
- When fully occupied, GCCC will employ a staff up to 345: 239 Correctional Officers, 18 Probation Officers, and 88 support personnel.

GCCC Operational Estimates

- Incoming Inmate Mail – 342,000 pieces of mail per year
- Laundry – 786,000 lbs of laundry per year
- Meals – 1,800,000 meals served per year (based on full occupancy)
- Visitation – 24,000 visits for inmates per year
- Recycling – 350,000 pounds per year will be recycled

Future Operations Financing

- FY2012 (DOC takes ownership in December, 2011): \$3,607.1
- FY2013 (Phased-in Medium Security Inmates): \$30,197.4
- FY2014 (Full Operations): \$50,485.7 (portion of out-of-state contract authorization anticipated to be reduced by \$21,030.6 and applied to GCCC Operations)
