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FISCAL NOTE

STATE OF ALASKA **2011 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**

BILL NO. HB 150

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Analysis
House Bill 150 makes several changes to the statutes that govern guardianships. Two of those changes will likely impact the court system, though the extent of the impact is too speculative to support a fiscal note and, in any event, may not be felt immediately.
Sections 6 and 7 allow for temporary conservators to be appointed within 72 hours of the filing of the petition and section 7 allows for ex parte protective orders when a person believes that an order is necessary to protect a vulnerable person from fraud.
The court's current experience with temporary guardianships (AS 13.26.140), and ex parte protective orders issued in other contexts suggests that the passage of this bill will result in more cases being filed that must be heard on short notice. If that increase becomes significant, and it likely will in the future, the court system may need to return to the legislature for additional funding. At this point, however, the number of conservatorship peitions filed each year is not great enough to warrant a fiscal note.

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
