## STATE OF ALASKA 2011 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

## Analysis:

This bill will have no significant fiscal impact on Behavioral Health. HB224 will broaden AS 11.76.100, which currently prohibits selling or giving tobacco products to persons under 19, to encompass all nicotine products, with an exception for tobacco cessation products provided by the minor's parent or prescribed by a licensed physician.						
If enacted, this bill would not impact our Synar Tobacco Enforcement requirements, but will have some limited impact on our general compliance and enforcement activities that occur outside of Synar. We do not believe it will impact us to the extent that additional funds or a change in our practices will occur.
