Efficiency Measure - DISCUSSION PURPOSES ONLY - The cost of assessments per student test taken. The assessment costs are not a program but rather a contractual obligation to administer a measurement instrument under the prescriptive nature of the statutory and regulatory authority. According to the presentation provided by Craig Holt, a measure is something that causes you to take action based on the results. Without this comprehensive system of assessments, the State has no means of measuring success or documenting areas of concern. Open, competitive formal solicitation processes conducted under AS 36.30 the State Procurement Code ensures current market based pricing.

Using only the Standards Based Assessment and High School Graduation Qualifying Examination administered by Data Recognition Corporation (DRC): \$7,818,289 (FY12 Contract with DRC) / 269,829 = \$28.97

Problem with this efficiency measure it that it would likely only increase over time, and there is no standard to compare against. However, this measure does allow policymakers to see what the cost per assessment is for each test taken by a student. Another option would be to look at cost per Proficient student, however no standard exists to compare this against.

**Effectiveness Measure -** Performance of students over time as outlined in performance results in the EED overview.

Using Adequate Yearly Progress in 2005 Reading/language arts: 75% Proficient; Mathematics: 66% Proficient. In 2011 reading/language arts: 76.2% Proficient; Mathematics: 68.8% Proficient.

The Alaska Developmental Profile (DP) showed modest progress in three of the five measureable categories for communication, language and literacy when comparing 2009-2010 results to 2010-2011. Of the two remaining categories one showed a slight decrease and the other showed no change.

The 2010-2011 DP scores for the Communications, Language and Literacy domain are as follows:

- 1. Uses receptive communications skills 1.55
- 2. Uses expressive communication skills 1.47
- 3. Demonstrates phonological awareness 1.28
- 4. Demonstrates awareness of print concepts 1.36
- 5. Demonstrates knowledge of letters and symbols (alphabet knowledge) 1.38
