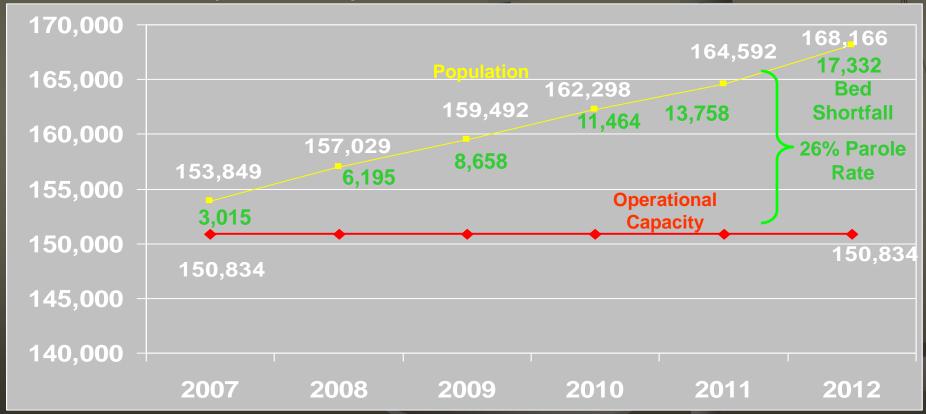

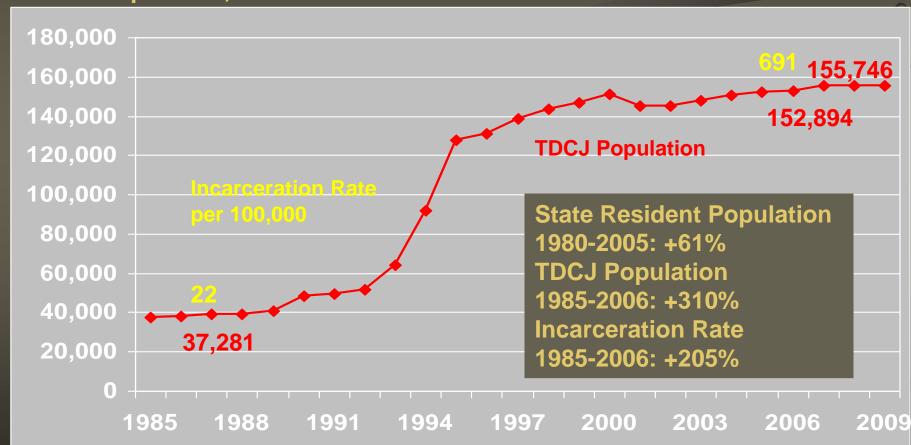
Projected Prison Bed Shortfall at Beginning of Legislative Session in January 2007

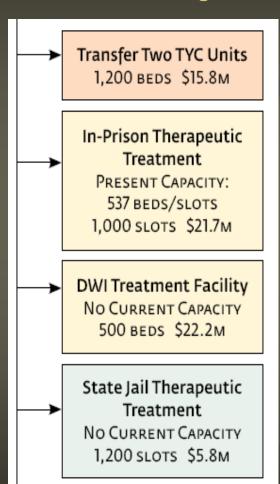

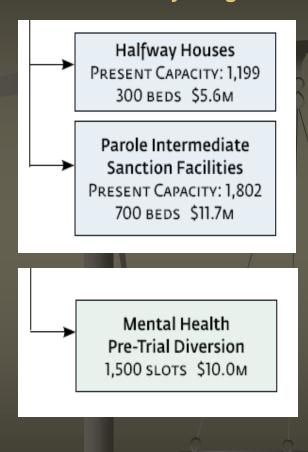

SB 156 by Shapiro and Madden

\$5.8 million in FY 09 and \$8.9 million in FY 11 to intervene with 2,000 families in high risk neighborhoods



Overview



Positive Program Effects Found in First Trial at Child Age 15:

Benefits to Children

- 48% reduction in child abuse and neglect
- 59% reduction in arrests
- 90% reduction in adjudications as PINS (person in need of supervision) for incorrigible behavior

Benefits to Mothers

- 61% fewer arrests
- 72% fewer convictions
- 98% fewer days in jail

Challenge of Program Implementation in a Nutshell

- 1. Program protocols effectively identify "swingers"
- 2. Program protocols effectively mix "treatment" "control" and "incentives"

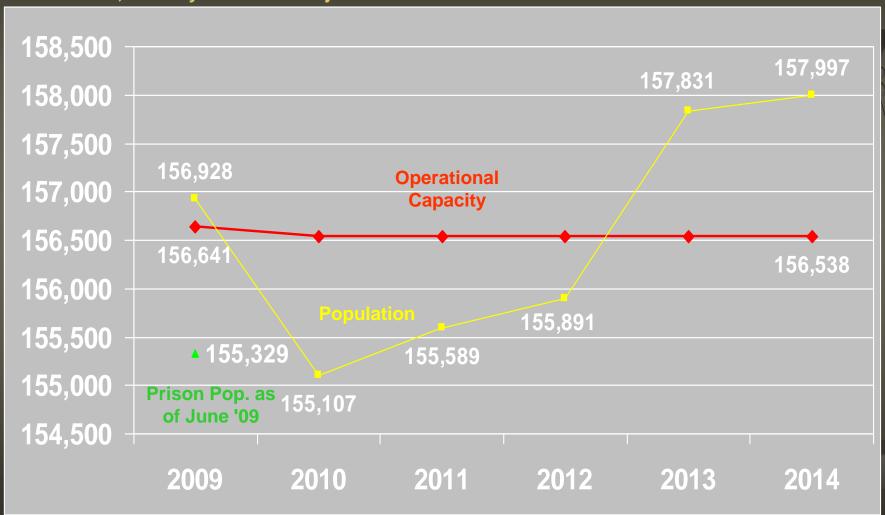

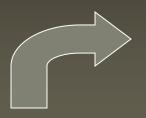
