
• AS 14.03.015 State education policy

 It is the policy of this state that the purpose of education is to help ensure that all students will succeed in their education and work, shape worthwhile and satisfying lives for themselves, exemplify the best values of society, and be effective in improving the character and quality of the world about them.

Statute & Regulation

- 14.07.020(b)(1) Duties of the department
 - Shall develop performance standards in reading, writing, and mathematics to be met at designated age levels by each student in public schools in the state.
 - Shall develop a comprehensive system of student assessments, composed of multiple indicators of proficiency in reading, writing, and mathematics
- 4 AAC 04.010(c) Statewide goals; purposes and responsibilities
 - The content standards identify student abilities that evidence mastery of a subject area. The content standards are not graduation requirements or curriculum, but they establish what constitutes excellent educational results and allow a school district to tailor its curriculum to the conditions, goals, and expectations of its community.
