Historical Information: Ethics records indicate the three programs have been listed as requiring disclosure since 1993. In 1993 a major effort was undertaken by the Ethics Office, based on new legislation, to audit all state departments to determine what state benefit and loan programs did not meet certain criteria and therefore participation would require disclosure. The final decision to add/delete a state benefit and loan program was determined by the Ethics Committee. Attached is paperwork from 1993 and 1995 from the Department of Health and Social Services.

Dear Mr. Thomas,

With regard to the request for the Department of Health and Social Services to review our Benefit and Loan Programs, the Department contends that the following programs do meet the standards under AS 24.60.050 and should be removed from the list.

Certificate of Need program is a review process used to promote responsive health facility and service development, rational health planning, health care quality, access to health care, and health care cost containment. Certificate of Need is a regulatory requirement for engaging in certain activities in this state; not a benefit or loan program. It appears the Certificate of Need program does meet the three standards delineated in the ethics memo. Certificate of Need determinations and the ability to apply for Certificate of Need approval are generally available to members of the public. Applications for a Certificate of Need are reviewed under fixed review standards that are adopted by regulation. Many of the standards are expressly objective since they are formula driven. Finally, there is minimal discretion in determining qualification since a reviewer must apply the regulations and review standards to the Certificate of Need application.

Health Facilities Licensing and Certification is a section in the Division of Health Care Services that is responsible for Medicare certification functions created by section 1864 of the Social Security Act. Like the Certificate of Need program, these are regulatory requirements not a benefit or loan program. Health Facilities Licensing and Certification issues federal certification and state licenses to health care facilities that are in compliance with Medicare and/or Medicaid regulatory and State licensure requirements. The section conducts initial surveys (inspections), annual recertification surveys, and complaint investigations for 17 different types of healthcare providers in the State of Alaska. The primary purpose of Health Facilities Licensing and Certification is to verify health care facilities in our state are in compliance with federal and state regulations and ensure vulnerable Alaskans are provided quality healthcare and protected from potential incidents of abuse and neglect.

The two most recent RFP's were: 1) to investigate the feasibility of implementing a Statewide Health Care Facility Data Base and 2) a feasibility study of a Unique Client Identifier for Departmental databases. We seem to manage about one RFP per year.

The Planning group follows State of Alaska and Department of Health and Social Services Policies and Procedures when developing the RFP's. A Proposal Evaluation Committee of Department employees (between 4-6 persons) uses a predetermined evaluation form to grade the Proposals. The award is made to the Proposer that scores highest on the evaluation (all factors are included i.e. cost, Alaskan's with Disabilities Preference, Alaska Bidder Preference, and other statutory preferences).
