


Historical VPSO Budget






VPSO Positions Allocated to each Grantee































Village with Regular VPSO Coverage

Nunapitchuk, Population 517










% of Alaska Children Receiving D.A.R.E. % of Alaska Children Receiving D.A.R.E. by a VPSO






VPSO D.A.R.E. Community Statistics

Number of Communities in Alaska receiving D.A.R.E. VPSO Communities receiving D.A.R.E.






















Alaska Youth Academy






FY14 Significant Operating Changes **VPSO**

AHFC Housing Program

- VPSO housing projects are either complete or underway in the following eight communities; Napaskiak, Napakiak, Gambell, Koyuk, Manokotak, Saxman, Akiak, and Igiugig.
- FY2011 Award to AVCP for Igiugig (completed) and Akiak (completed)
- FY 2012 Award to the City of Manokotak (completed) and the City of Saxman (will be completed by end of the year 2013)
- FY 2013 Award to AVCP for Napaskiak and Napakiak (both under construction), the Bering Straits School District (one unit in Gambell, under construction), and the City of Koyuk (completing pre-grant award requirements)
- Hooper Bay and Illiama new awards this past year.




