FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 276

Analysis

The bill amends AS 23.10.055 to add a new subsection to exempt certain employees of motor vehicle dealers from the Alaska Wage and Hour Act thus eliminating the responsibility of the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to ensure Wage and Hour Act compliance.

There is no fiscal impact to the department anticipated as a result of this legislation.
