We are approaching 17 years of marriage and have lived a mobile military lifestyle, moving on average every 2 years. Although "home" has been wherever the Air Force sent us, we are also allowed a "home of record" for tax purposes. Likewise, due to the Military Spouse Residency Relief Act, I have been able to maintain my driver's license in that state as well. It has recently come to my attention that Alaska does not recognize this as law.

Simply said, "We serve too!", and whatever you could do to make our mobile military lifestyle and an already stressful relocation process (to and from) less troublesome would be the right thing to do. Please pass Bill 212 that would change Alaska's current position and allow dependent spouses to keep out-of-state driver's licenses.
