FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

**STATE OF ALASKA
2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**

BILL NO. HB 275

Analysis

By statute the Office of the Lieutenant Governor manages the Online Public Notice System (OPNS) for the State of Alaska. Over the past two years a new system was developed by this office that has increased capacity and can support more data than its current usage.

Implementation of this bill requires more storage, there will be no additional cost to the Office of the Lt. Governor because the new system has the ability to store the larger volume of data required. By adding "reports" as defined in the bill, the effect on the OPNS would be miniscule.

As explained above, the Office of the Lieutenant Governor develops and manages the OPNS – the addition of reports as a category would not require a modification of the system. This bill would also not require additional personnel or maintenance on the part of this office.
