FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

House Bill 218 would modify the existing aggravating factor for sentencing that concerns a defendant's prior criminal history, AS 12.55.155(c)(31). Specifically, it provides that a prior offense that is an assault on a correctional employee will not be considered part of a "continuous episode" that would be counted as a single conviction; instead, those assaults would be counted separately when determining the defendant's prior crimes.

The court can apply this aggravating factor with no fiscal impact. Therefore, the Alaska Court System submits this zero fiscal note for HB 218.
