FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 218

Analysis

Currently, when determining an aggravated sentence, if a defendant has five or more prior class A misdemeanors, those offenses which arose out of the same offense episode are counted as one conviction. However, if the offenses involve resisting arrest, escape, or an assault on a peace officer they are counted as separate convictions. HB 218 adds assaults on correctional employees to the list of misdemeanors that will be counted as separate convictions regardless of whether or not they arose out of the same offense episode when determining an aggravated sentence.

Any additional time served by an offender as a result of this aggravator will result in an increase in mandays to the Department. However, the number of assaults on correctional employees is relatively minimal, therefore, this bill will have no fiscal impact on the Department.
