Analysis

The proposed legislation requires the department to provide, in addition to reasonable public notification, time for public comment when pesticides and broadcast chemicals are applied in a public place and adds transportation rights-of-way to the definition of public place. The proposed legislation also adds restrictions and processes for public notice and comment with respect to locations near anadromous or resident fish habitat or near a public or private water source and also includes transportation rights-of-way in the definition of public place.

There is no fiscal impact on the department.
