


OBJ 2: Increase the number of juveniles who remain crime-free

Efficiency Measures: <u>Cost per day</u> of Probation, Detention and Institutional Treatment services


Effectiveness Measures: <u>Rate of success</u> for juveniles committed to Probation, Detention and Institutional Treatment services

Strategies to Increase Efficiencies and Improve Outcomes

Reduce health care cost through:
Development of statewide on-call nursing
Partnership with Division of Health Care Services

- Maximize use of juvenile facilities
- Collaborate with families, Depts. of Labor and Workforce Development and Education and Early Development, tribal entities, and others
- Address behavioral needs of youth: increased clinical capacity, Trauma Informed Care, and incident tracking


