The land on which the Interior Alaska Cemetery is to be developed requires that the State of Alaska mitigate, or preserve, the impacts of development to the western end of the property. This section of the property has a portion of the Davidson Ditch, a 90 mile conduit built in the 1920s to supply water to gold mining dredges in central Alaska and is a part of Fairbanks Gold Rush history. Federal law prevents the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs from giving the state any money for the cemetery project until this issue is resolved. This issue was unknown before as it is site specific. Mitigation on this property will include the physical preservation, minor restoration and documentation of the site to provide public information and access to this section of the Davidson Ditch, which will then allow for construction of the cemetery in accordance with current historic preservation laws. The Department of Military and Veteran's Affairs (DMVA) is working cooperatively with the Department of Natural Resources State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and they will be providing federal matching funds for this project.

Bryant Airfield - The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs is responsible for 24 facilities totaling 147,774 square feet and the campus' airfield runway, taxiways, parking, storage yards, and roadways. This project provides design bid ready documents (DBRD) to expand/lengthen the runway to accommodate all aircraft in the Army inventory. It also installs an oil/water separator in Hangar 2 to meet federal Clean Water Act requirements.

Totals:

Camp Denali - The DMVA is responsible for 30 facilities totaling 452,230 square feet and the campus' communication towers, parking lots, roadways, military vehicle and equipment storage yards. This project expands military and private vehicle parking and installs roadway lighting.

Alaska Military Youth Academy (AMYA) - The DMVA is responsible for 23 facilities totaling over 68,214 square feet and the campus' lighting, parking and roadways. This project provides a mass notification system to deliver announcements and safety information to youth and staff. It also constructs a bus barn that will protect AMYA's busses from the weather to extend their useful life.

Project Description/Justification:

Federal authority for Army Guard construction, contingency, and planning projects allows the State of Alaska to receive year-end National Guard Bureau (NGB) funding, made available when other states are not able to fully execute their federal appropriations. This is especially likely during budget cycles that are under a Continuing Resolution. DMVA has identified over \$450 million in Sustainment, Modernization, and Military Construction projects that address facility and training site shortfalls in Alaska. Over the long term, DMVA is addressing these shortfalls by requesting federal authority as funding becomes available through the annual federal budget cycle. However, in late September, when NGB identifies additional modernization and sustainment projects from DMVA's list that can be fulfilled with year-end funding, the department must have the authority to accept these dollars and meet the federal requirement that the department encumber them by September 30, the end of the federal fiscal year.



Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

The State of Alaska receives State Homeland Security grants from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. The grants provide for programs across the state for homeland security planning, equipment, and emergency training exercises. In support of the department's mission, these programs address issues of life, safety, and protection of infrastructure, and are necessary for effective citizen preparedness, local first response, and statewide emergency preparedness.

Project Description/Justification:

Bryant Airfield – The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA) is responsible for 24 facilities on Bryant Airfield, totaling 147,774 square feet and the campus' airfield runway, taxiways, parking, storage yards, and roadways. This project replaces, repairs, seals, and paints the asphalt and concrete in parking areas, roadways, runway and taxiway to extend the useful life. This project will also replace hazardous material storage lockers that are no longer serviceable.

Camp Denali – DMVA is responsible for 30 facilities totaling 452,230 square feet and the campus' communication towers, parking lots, roadways, military vehicle and equipment storage yards. This project repairs/replaces asphalt in existing parking and storage yards around building 49040 and 49150; repairs the loading dock at building 49000; upgrades lighting at the United States Property and Fiscal Office (USPFO) vehicle/equipment storage yard, and state warehouse; replaces carpet in in B-Wing classroom and the Public Affairs office; and provides for design bid-ready documents for the programed roof replacement for building 49040.

Camp Carroll – DMVA is responsible for 35 facilities totaling over 93,995 square feet and the campus' lighting, parking and roadways. This project paints and provides code compliance for building 57226; upgrades the fire detection system to building 57040; replaces the roofs of buildings 60606 and 60608; upgrades the lighting and electrical service for building 60820; and repairs/replaces failing asphalt and concrete on roadways and parking areas.

AMYA – DMVA is responsible for 23 facilities totaling over 68,214 square feet and the campus' lighting, parking and roadways. The Army National Guard constructed these facilities in the 1970's for annual two week trainings. Alaska established the Department of Defense's Youth ChalleNGe residential program in 1994. The state has since provided modifications and deferred maintenance but facilities still require work to adequately support mission and program needs. This project replaces the older heating plants with new energy efficient heaters for building 60710, 60724, and 60726; replaces windows and insulation in buildings 60728, 60730, 60732, and 60734; upgrades lighting in furnace rooms; replaces damaged roof ventilators; and to re-plumbs the condensation trays in the restrooms.

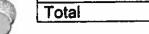

Deferred maintenance projects at the Kodiak Launch Complex include: repair, replace, restore, upgrade, or refurbish drainage systems; heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) units: generators; and flight safety systems; and communication components. The useful life of many of these items has been exceeded, can create health and safety issues, and no longer meet industry standards.

There have been changes in technology due to changes in industry requirements since the construction of Kodiak Launch Complex facilities. This has placed additional electronic equipment within the facility envelopes, creating higher than anticipated heat loads. Existing HVAC systems are no longer capable of maintaining proper temperature control and could potentially cause failure of equipment and sensitive electronic components. Additional ventilation is also needed for safety of personnel. The facility back-up power generator is mission critical and must be replaced to support the additional electrical load requirements during the ramp-up to flight countdown and liftoff.



Facility drainage systems and the structural integrity of access aprons are failing. entrances which are experiencing erosion and deterioration. The replacement of the large roll up door and floor drains at the Payload Processing Facility are required to meet industry standards of cleanliness and requirements of customer payload processing.

Flight safety systems are currently built on antiquated systems architecture that is no longer supported. Replacement of hardware and software is required to ensure the safety of range personnel, customers and the public.

Projects will improve personnel and customer safety, prolong facility life and reduce operational and maintenance costs. Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency maintenance projects not listed, actual project costs, and other considerations.
