STATE OF ALASKA 2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB183

Analysis

SB183 extends the termination date of the Emerging Energy Technology Fund until January 1, 2020. Currently the fund is scheduled to sunset on January 1, 2015.

There is no fiscal impact to the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) with the passage of this proposed legislation. AEA would continue to manage the emerging energy technology fund grant program. If the sunset provision becomes effective, the emerging energy technology fund grant program would not continue; however, the Alaska Energy Authority would be required to continue to manage ongoing projects.
