## **Analysis**

This bill has no fiscal impact on the division.		
Section 1 states that if a municipal election is conducted in the manner in which voters cast ballots at a pollig place, the board is appointed by the appropriate municipality.		
Section 2 states that if a governing body chooses to conduct their elections in a manner in which voters cast their ballots at a polling place, then they would be required to have a board made up of at least 3 judges per precinct.
