FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

**STATE OF ALASKA
2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**

BILL NO. HB 362

Analysis

This bill would make it unlawful to offer, display, market, advertise for sale, or sell illicit synthetic drugs by making it a violation punishable by a \$500 fine.

This bill would not change the Alaska State Troopers' enforcement efforts. Persons found in violation of the law would be issued a citation as is currently done for other offenses that are defined as violations. Additionally, it is anticipated that most citations would be issued by municipal law enforcement agencies where many of the shops currently selling these substances are located.

Therefore, it is expected that passage of this bill would have no fiscal impact to the Department of Public Safety.
