FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB362

Analysis

House Bill 362 adds a new section to the Alaska Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act in Title 17 to make the display, marketing, advertising, or sale of illicit synthetic drugs a violation of the law. The Commissioner of Public Safety would be responsible for enforcing the new provisions, and may cooperate with the Department of Health and Social Services in carrying out the enforcement activities.

New AS 17.21.030(c) states that a person who violates the law is guilty of a violation; violations are punishable by a fine of up to \$500. Though this has the potential to lead to an increase in the number of violations that the court handles, the Court System anticipates that this will not result in any measurable increase in work load that would have a fiscal impact.

The Court System therefore submits this zero fiscal note.
