FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB336

Analysis

HB366 amends AS 04.11.100(f) and AS 04.11.410 to increase the minimum distance required between beverage dispensaries, package stores, and certain exempt restaurants or eatings places and schools or churches.

The change to AS 04.11.410 increases the restriction of beverage dispensaries and package stores to 400 feet from 200 feet in proximity to schools and churches. The change in AS 04.11.100(f) is necessary to maintain consistency in statute, but no effect exists for future restaurant/eating place license applicants since this section only applies to licensees that are exempt from the definition of "bona fide restaurant or eating place" because of their original date of licensure.

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
