### FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS #1

## Analysis

This legislation sets the fee for medical treatments provided outside of Alaska to limits in the Workers' Compensation statutes of the state where the services are rendered.
It also requires a provider of medical treatment or services under the Alaska Workers' Compensation Act to submit bills for treatment or services to employers within 180 days after the date the treatment or services are rendered, and limits the time for appealing an employer's denial or reduction of a bill to 60 days.
The effective date is immediate and there is a retroactivity clause, but there is transitional language. This language establishes that medical providers may submit bills for service within 180 days of the effective date of the legislation, irrespective of the date of service; or an appeal for denied payment within 60 days of the effective date of the legislation, irrespective of the date of the disputed payment.
There is no fiscal impact to the department anticipated as a result of this legislation.
