FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB309

Analysis

HB309 adds section 04.11.175 related to craft distillery licensing. This section allows sales of one gallon a day to a person present on the licensed premises for consumption off the premises, and five gallons per day to a person licensed under Title IV or in another state or country. Additionally, this section allows the distillery to give tours and provide small samples free of charge. This section grants similar provisions to craft distillery licensees as are granted to brewery and winery licensees.

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
