 - 1974 Regional Educational Attendance Areas (REAA)

Positive Deviance

- A few communities have already solved the problem.
- Example High Dropout Rates in Rural Elementary Schools in Argentina (2002)
- When to Consider Approach




Results - Alaska's High Schools

- Positive Deviant High Schools
 - Top 20% or 47 schools
 - 15% to 46% Achieving Advanced
 Proficiency
 - 62% to 96% Achieving a Minimum
 Proficiency or Greater
- Answer #1 Research Question = YES

- Local Police
- Parent Survey Return Rate
- Voter Participation Rate

- % of community w/ Bachelor degree or higher
- % of community w/ HS Diploma/GED or higher

- Language
 - % of community speaking an Alaska Native language
 - % of students without Limited English Proficiency
