Analysis

House Bill 33 would adopt definitions of the terms "gravity knife" and "switchblade" in Title 11 dealing with substantive criminal law.			
The bill would also give to the state the authority to regulate knives, so that a municipality could regulate conduct in relation to knives only as specifically allowed by statute. This is similar to the authority of the state to regulate firearms.			
It is anticipated this legislation will have no fiscal impact on the Department of Law.
