Analysis

Passage of this legislation will increase the minimum amounts for property values associated with property thefts.

This legislation would impact the number of offenders incarcerated under this statute by changing what is currently a felony conviction to a misdemeanor conviction. At this time, data is not available for the Department to calculate the number of offenders who would be sentenced as misdemeanors under this bill. The Department will continue to monitor the potential impacts of this legislation.
