## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

### Analysis

The proposed legislation increases the fee for a seven-day crewmember fishing license from \$30 to \$60.

The Fishermen's Fund component within the Department of Labor and Workforce Development is funded by a percentage of revenue received from each resident and nonresident commercial fishermen's license and permit fee.

The Fishermen's Fund receives 39 percent of the revenue collected for each crewmember fishing license sold. Based on revenue projections provided by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, annual revenue to the Fishermen's Fund would increase by \$24.8 per year.
