Analysis

The bill grants the responsibilities and authorities under AS 30.30.010170 regarding abandoned and derelict vessels equally to all state agencies in the executive branch and to municipalities (as defined under AS 29.71.800) rather than to just the state Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOTPF). This provides additional statutory tools for the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to use to deal with abandoned and derelict vessels. The bill does not require the department to take any action to clean up abandoned and derelict vessels or utilize this authority.
The department does not anticipate any additional costs related to this legislation as it simply grants the department the same discretionary authority to deal with abandoned and derelict vessels as DOTPF currently has under AS 30.30.010 - 170.
