A RESOLUTION

Urging the United States Congress and the President of the United States to work to
amend the Constitution of the United States to prohibit corporations, unions, and other
organizations from making unlimited independent expenditures supporting or opposing
candidates for public office.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS a vast majority of Americans recognize that the influence of unlimited contributions by corporations, unions, and other organizations harms the ability of average citizens to have a voice in their own government; and

WHEREAS the narrow majority five to four decision of the United States Supreme Court in Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission, 558 U.S. 310 (2010), allows corporations, unions, and other organizations to make unlimited independent expenditures supporting or opposing a candidate for public office; and

WHEREAS unlimited independent expenditures from corporations, unions, and otherorganizations were prohibited until the ruling of the United States Supreme Court in CitizensUnited v. Federal Election Commission; and

WHEREAS the boards of directors and management of corporations, unions, and other organizations permitted to make unlimited independent expenditures may include individuals who are not citizens of the United States; and

WHEREAS few candidates for public office, regardless of their qualifications, capacity to raise funds, or campaigning capabilities, are able to counter the effects of unlimited contributions from corporations, unions, and other organizations; and

WHEREAS, unless the United States Supreme Court reverses its ruling, the only way to reverse the harmful effects of the Citizens United ruling is to amend the Constitution of the United States;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the United States Congress and the President of the United States to work across party lines to propose a constitutional amendment to prohibit corporations, unions, and other organizations from making unlimited independent expenditures.

COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Barack Obama, President of the United States; the Honorable Lisa Murkowski and the Honorable Mark Begich, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress; all other members of the 113th United States Congress; and the presiding officers of the legislatures of each of the other 49 states.
