I have attached my application to serve on the Board of Regents for the University of Alaska for your consideration.

I am a lifelong Alaska of Yupik descent who has devoted my entire adulthood to making Alaska a better place to live. As President and CEO of Cook Inlet Tribal Council since 1998, it has been my privilege to oversee one of the largest non-profit organizations in Anchorage – an organization which provides Alaska Native people with educational opportunities, workforce skills, family assistance, and addiction recovery services. During my tenure, CITC has expanded from an organization with an annual budget of \$8 million to one of more than \$40 million, and from a staff of less than 70 to almost 300.

I have built my career on the philosophy that true self-determination is based in self-sufficiency and the ability to take responsibility for one's own life, family, and community. For the past decade, I have worked to mold CITC into an organization that provides a "hand up instead of a hand out." Our goals are positive reflections of this attitude toward self-reliance, promoting educational opportunities and employment.

For individuals who must overcome personal challenges in order to take full advantage of the opportunities available to them, CITC offers the means to: conquer dependency on drugs and alcohol; finish school, or receive their GED; transform broken families into stable and nurturing homes for children; equip men and women to become better parents; enable the homeless to find a place to live; and forge a path toward healing the mentally ill through counseling and the creation of art. Through all of our services, we work to achieve excellence, with the understanding that programmatic excellence pays dividends in the number of people who will advance toward their own full potential.

I believe that the future of every Alaskan is interdependent with that of all Alaskans, and that no community exists in isolation. While CITC's focus is advancing the potential of Alaska Native people, our programs benefit individuals of many ethnicities, and help to improve the quality of life for everyone. As the leader of a major non-profit

agency, I also believe that it is my responsibility to work in collaboration with organizations not only in Anchorage but throughout Alaska in order to effectively use resources and achieve results for benefit of all our citizens.

I have a lifelong commitment to education, based in the belief that educational advancement is the surest path to self-realization, and to becoming a positive contributor to the community. I attribute my own achievements not only to the values instilled by my family, but also to the quality education that I received in Alaska's academic institutions, including the University of Alaska.

I believe that this is a time of profound change for all organizations: one that requires an unwavering focus on sustainability through effectiveness, accountability, and partnerships. Every organization must construct a roadmap toward the future — one that embraces the many complexities of our time, yet includes a compelling vision of the desired destination. To be meaningful, our plans must also provide clear and actionable goals, and measures of progress, to ensure continuous progress and ultimate success.

It would be my honor to work with the Board of Regents to help shape the future of the University of Alaska. I step forward for this service in gratitude for the educational opportunities that I have enjoyed, and to do my utmost to help others have the same opportunity.

I hope to bring my unique blend of skills and perspective to this work: the work of helping to make a great institution greater and stronger, and to be an even more powerful force in advancing the potential of all Alaskans.

- Transitioned CITC into an organization that acts as an ambassador of Native interests on a regional, statewide and national level.
