## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

### Analysis

HB 186 amends the definition of "police officer" under AS 18.65.290(7)(A) for purposes of Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) certification by removing the reference to "full-time" in that definition.

This change in the definition would mean that any person hired as a police officer by a municipal or state police department would be subject to the standards and minimum training requirements set by APSC for certification as a police officer regardless of whether they are employed full-time or not.

The subsequent increase in the number of applications for police officer certification the APSC would need to process is expected to be minimal and can be accommodated with existing resources. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
