FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2013 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 100

Analysis

This legislation prescribes the department's role in overseeing correspondence study programs. It requires that students enrolled in correspondence study programs have an individual learning plan with oversight from a certificated teacher, enroll in a course of study consistent with state standards, and participate in state-mandated assessments. It restricts the department from imposing any additional requirements on students who score proficient or advanced on statewide assessments. Additionally, this legislation permits parents of students in correspondence study programs to purchase services and materials from private and religious organizations.
Additionally, in its currrent draft form, the bill's language implies that EED will assume a monitoring/directing role for the educational program of individual correspondence study school students. It is unclear if the intent is for EED to regulate a district's role in directing the educational program for non-proficient students, or if the intent is for EED to regulate students' educational programs directly. The latter would prescribe a role for EED that is unlike its role for students in any other public school program.
The intent of Sec. 14.03.320(b)is unclear and additional clarification may be needed.
