Analysis

This bill makes it a crime to engage in hazing. Hazing is defined as knowingly engaging or creating a situation which subjects a student to the risk of physical injury for the purpose of initiation into or affiliation with an organization operating in connection with an elementary, junior high, secondary, or post-secondary school. Hazing is a class B felony.
The department does not anticipate a significant increase in convictions which would result in a fiscal impact, therefore, this bill has zero fiscal impact on the department.
