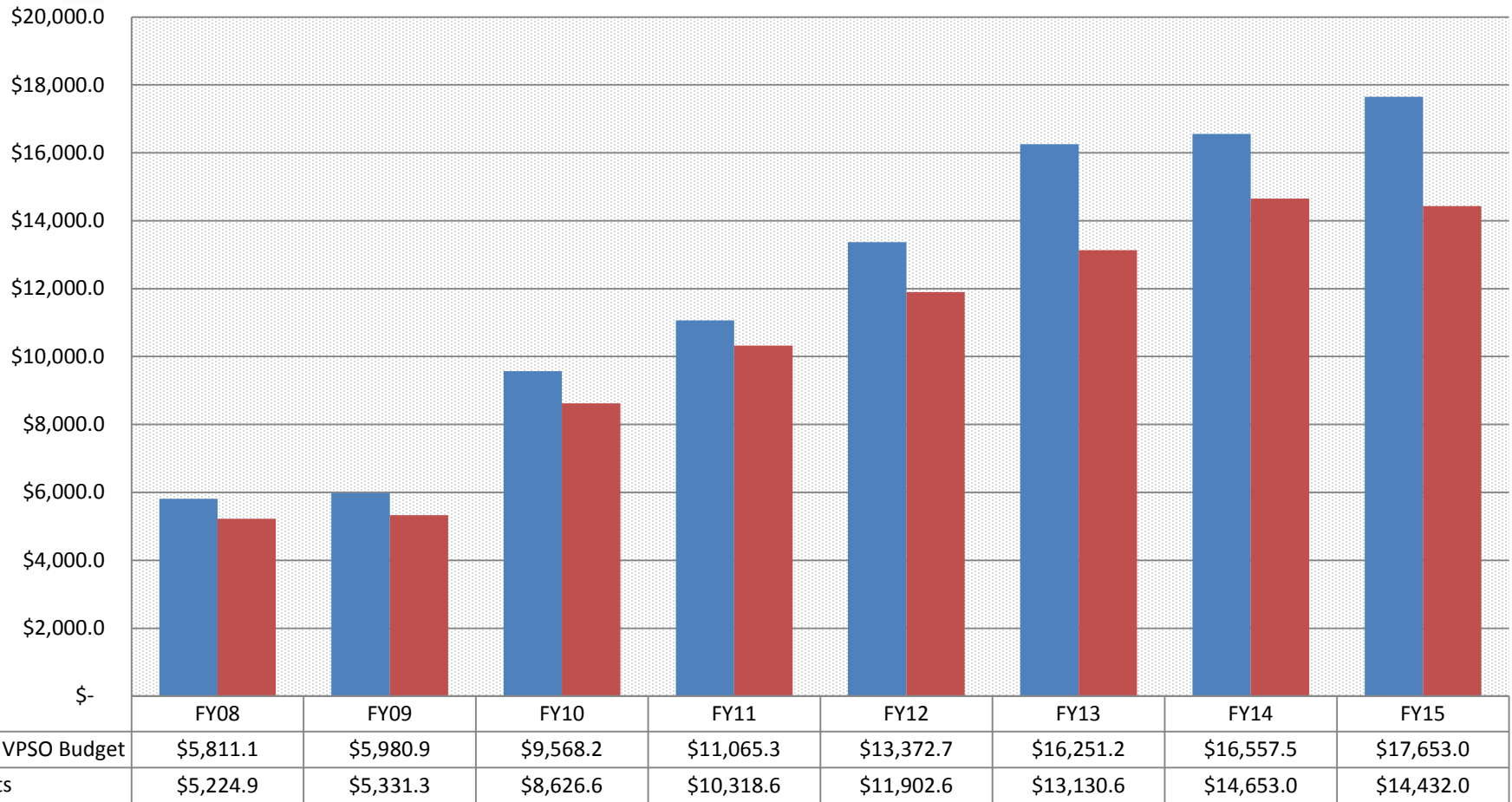

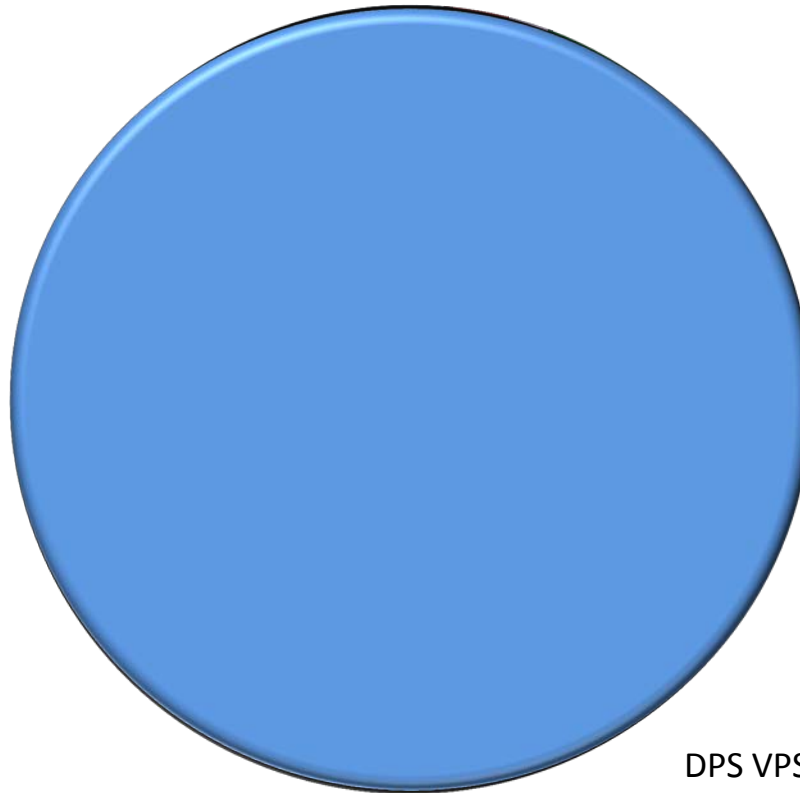

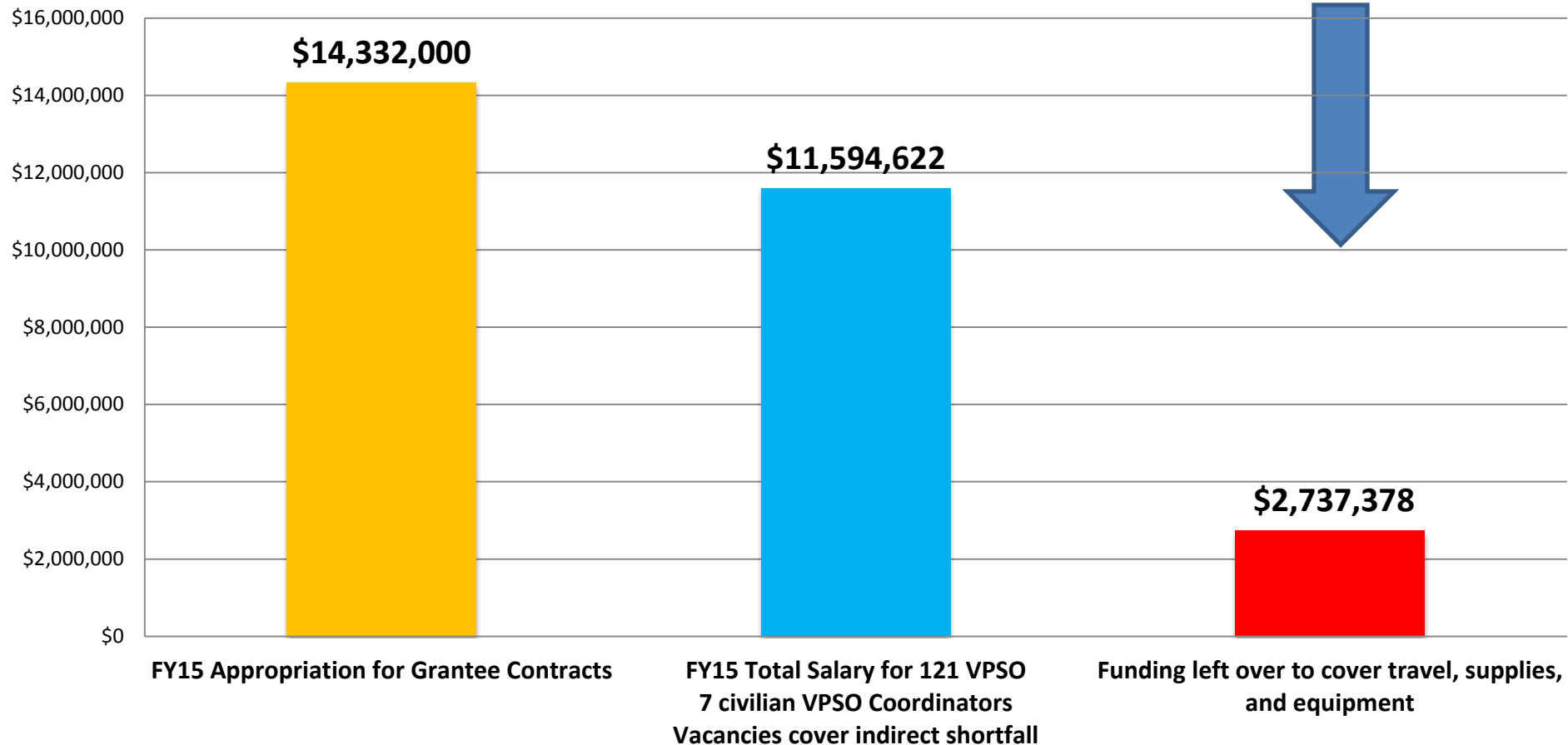

FY15 Significant Operating Changes - VPSO

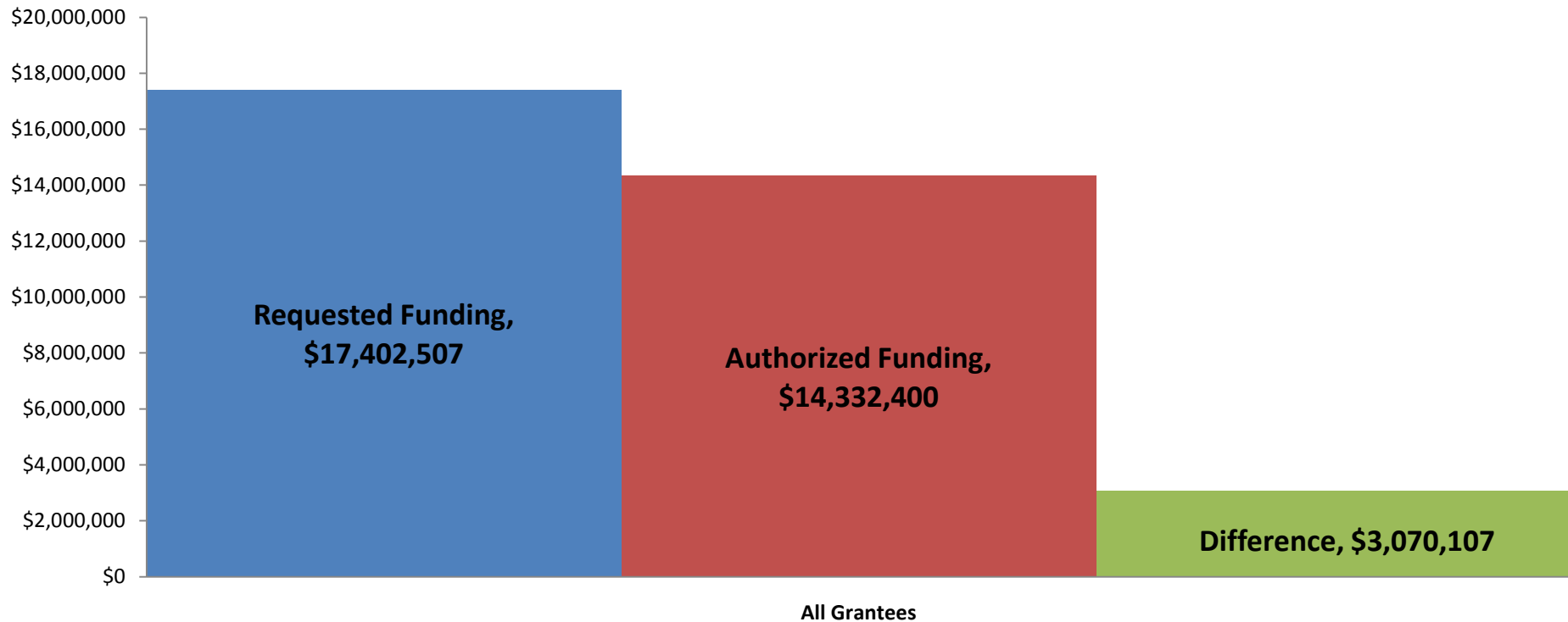
Appropriation for Grantees vs FY15 total salary costs for 121 VPSOs

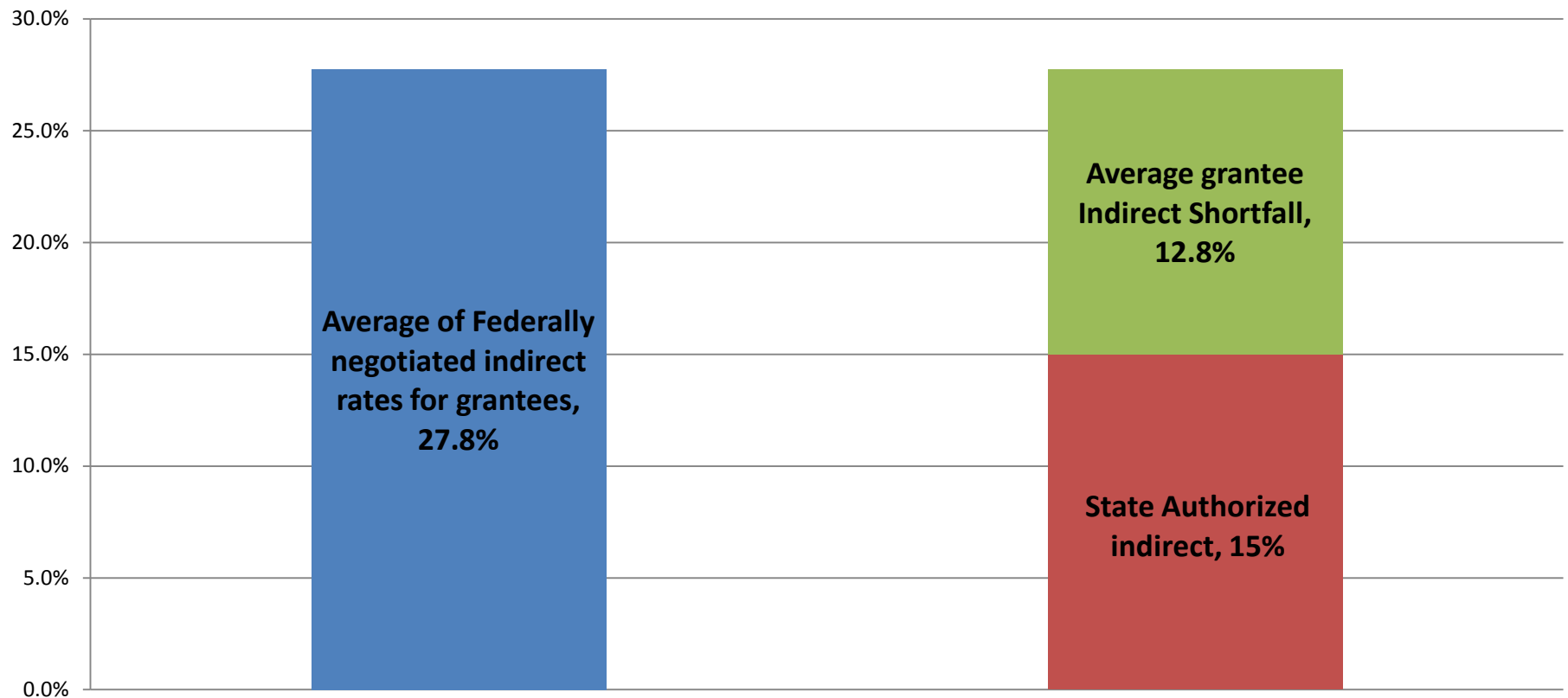
Grantee funding Requests vs. actual funding received

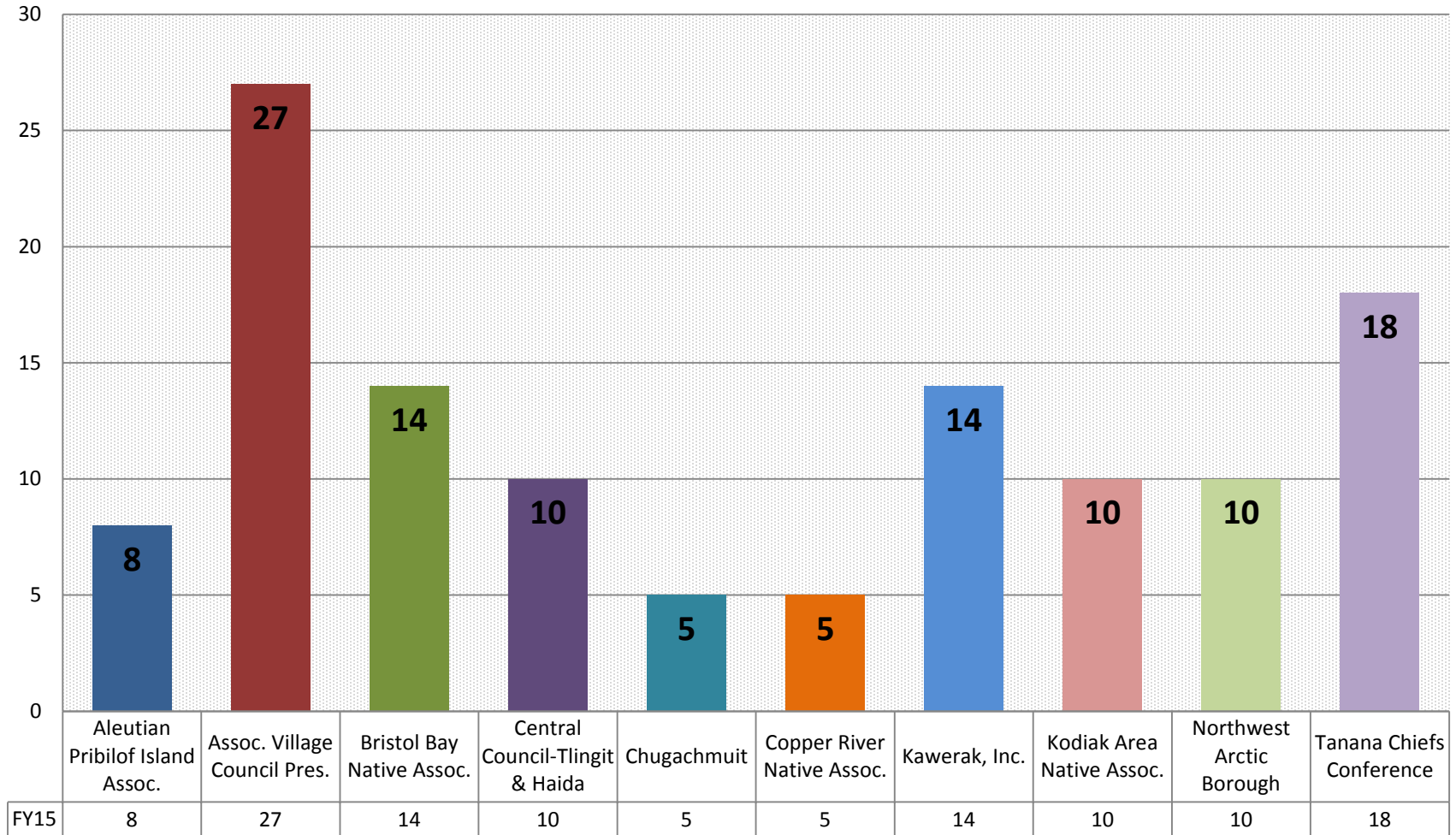

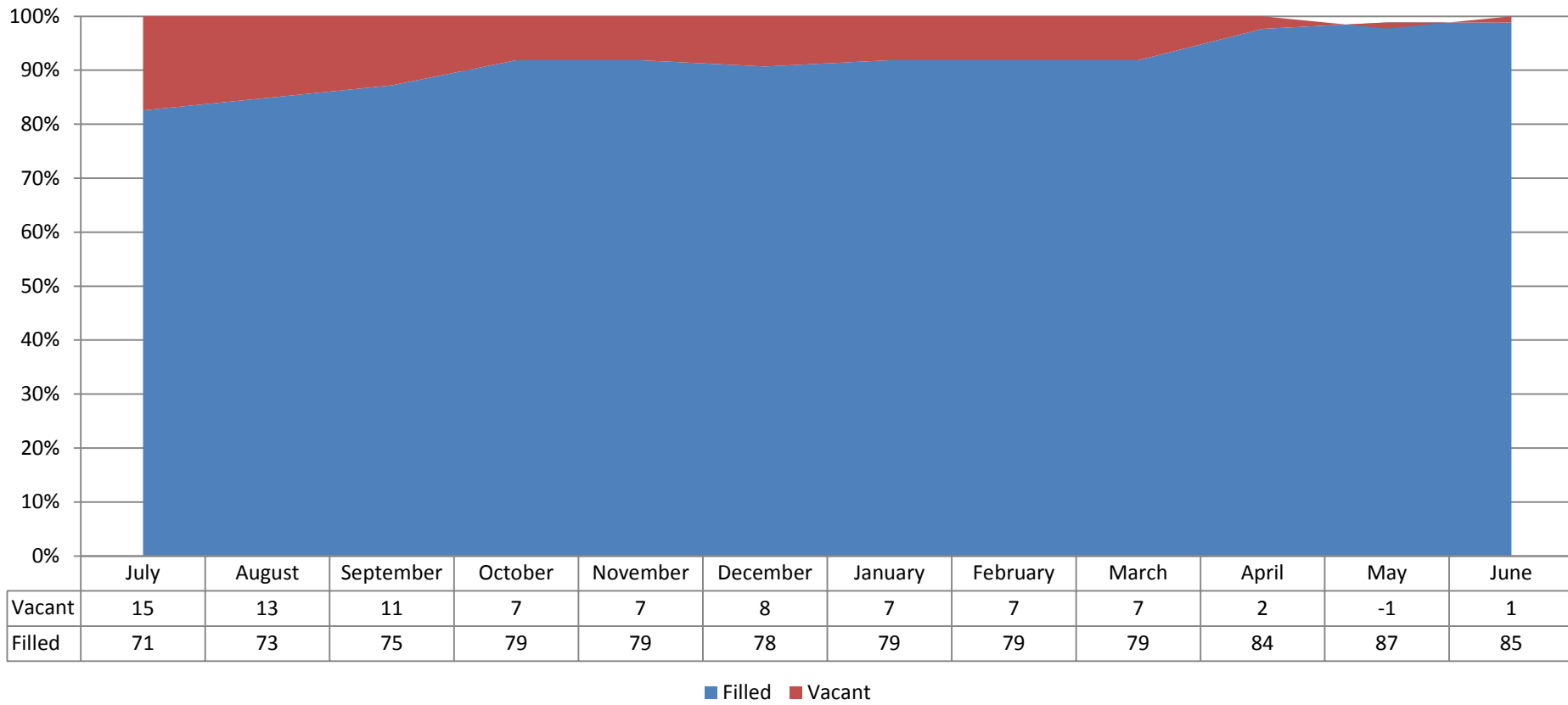
VPSO Positions Allocated to each Grantee

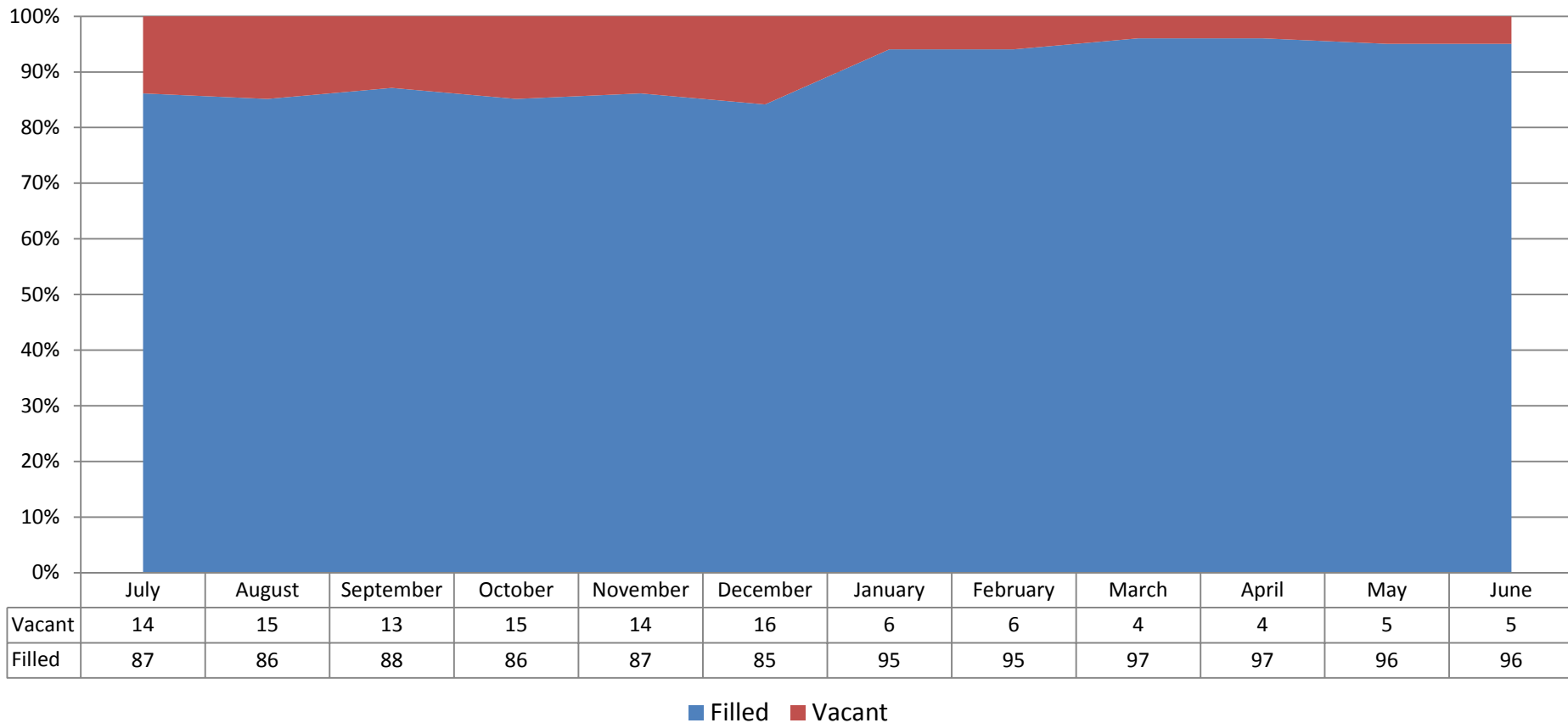
Program Vacancy per Month FY2011

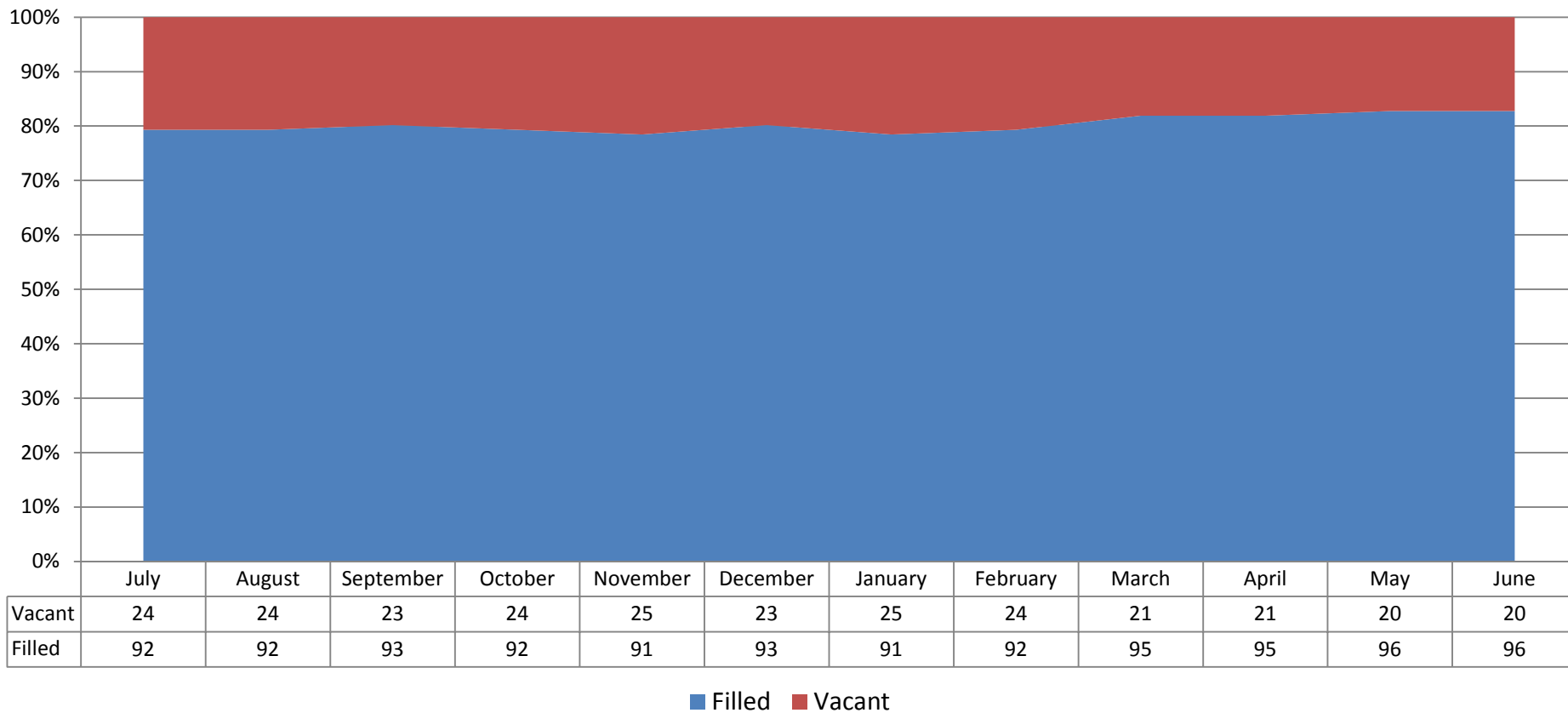
Program Vacancy per Month FY2012

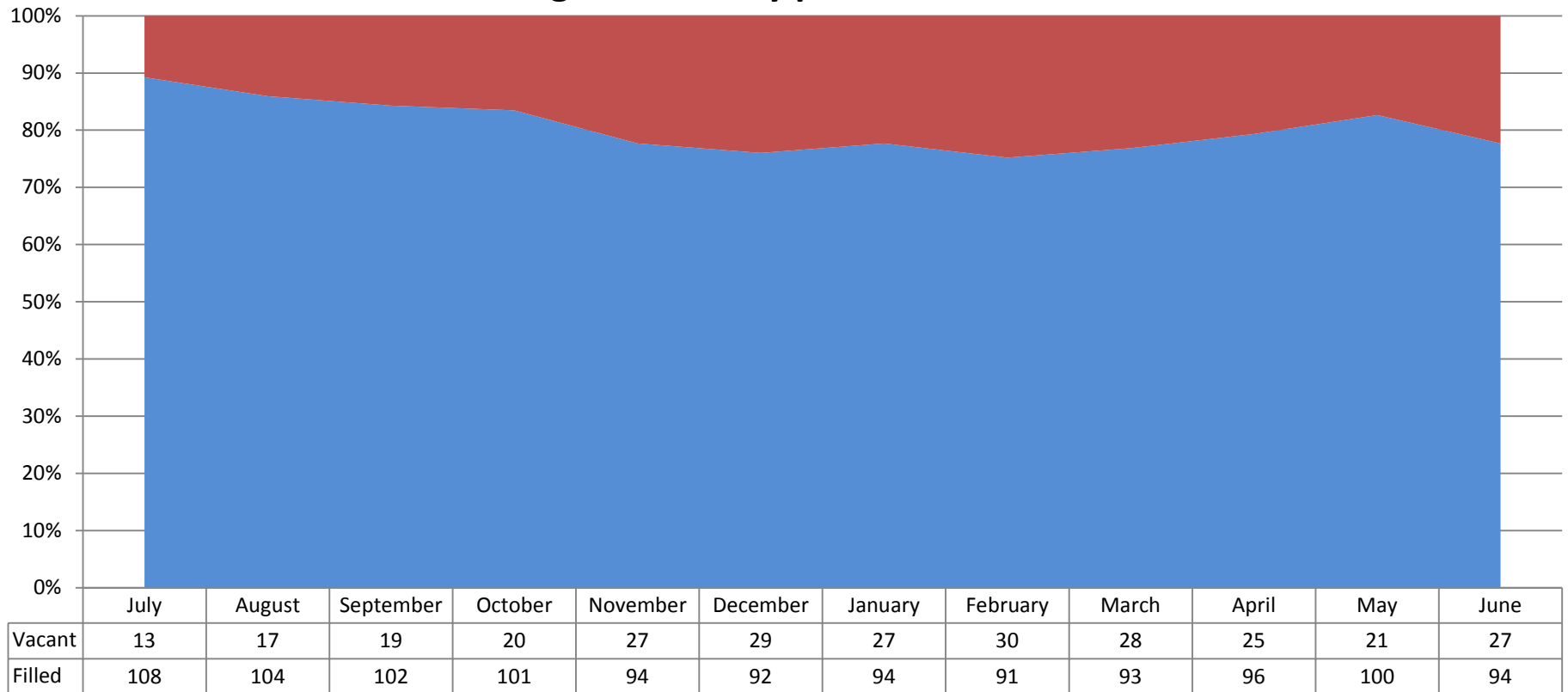
Program Vacancy per Month FY2013

Program Vacancy per Month FY2014

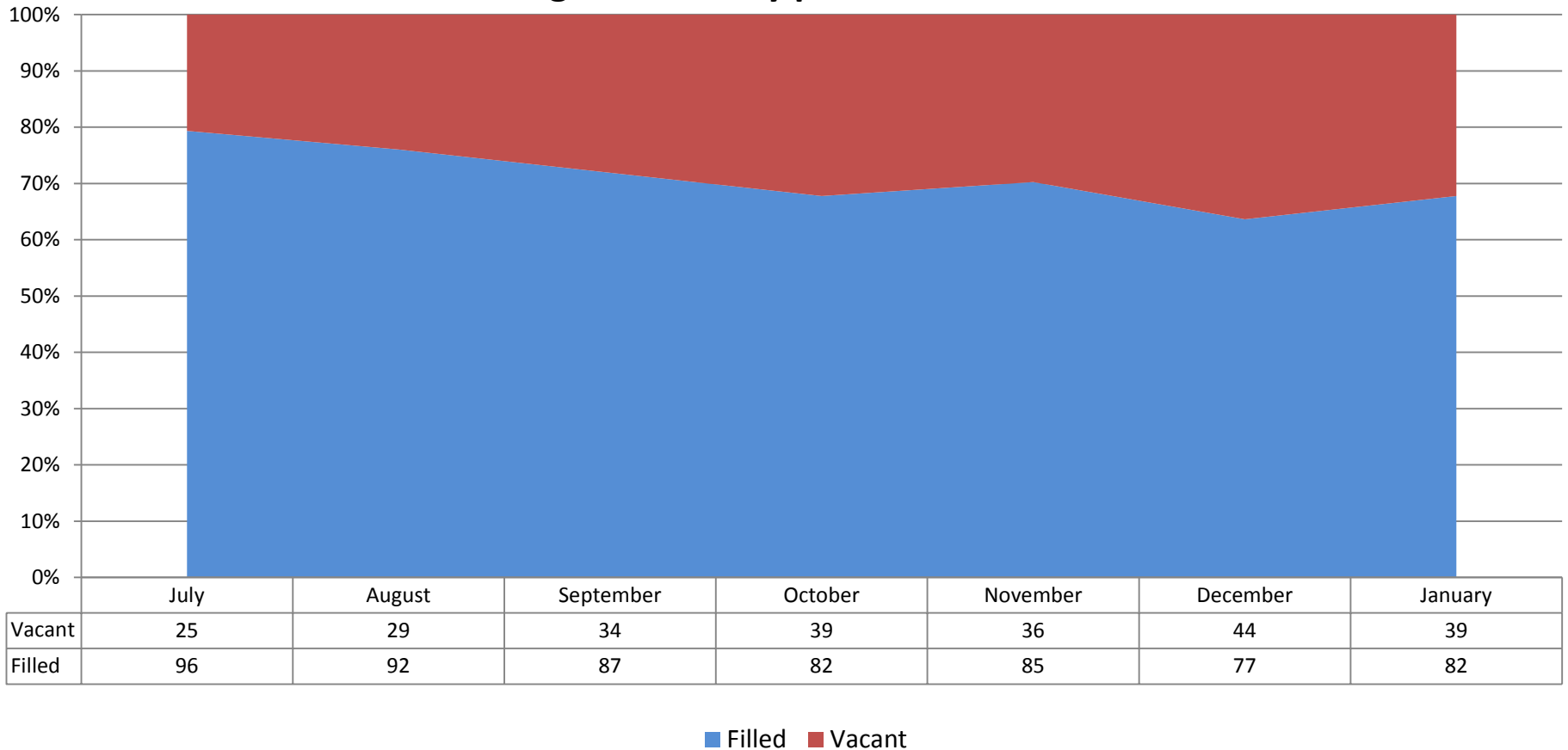

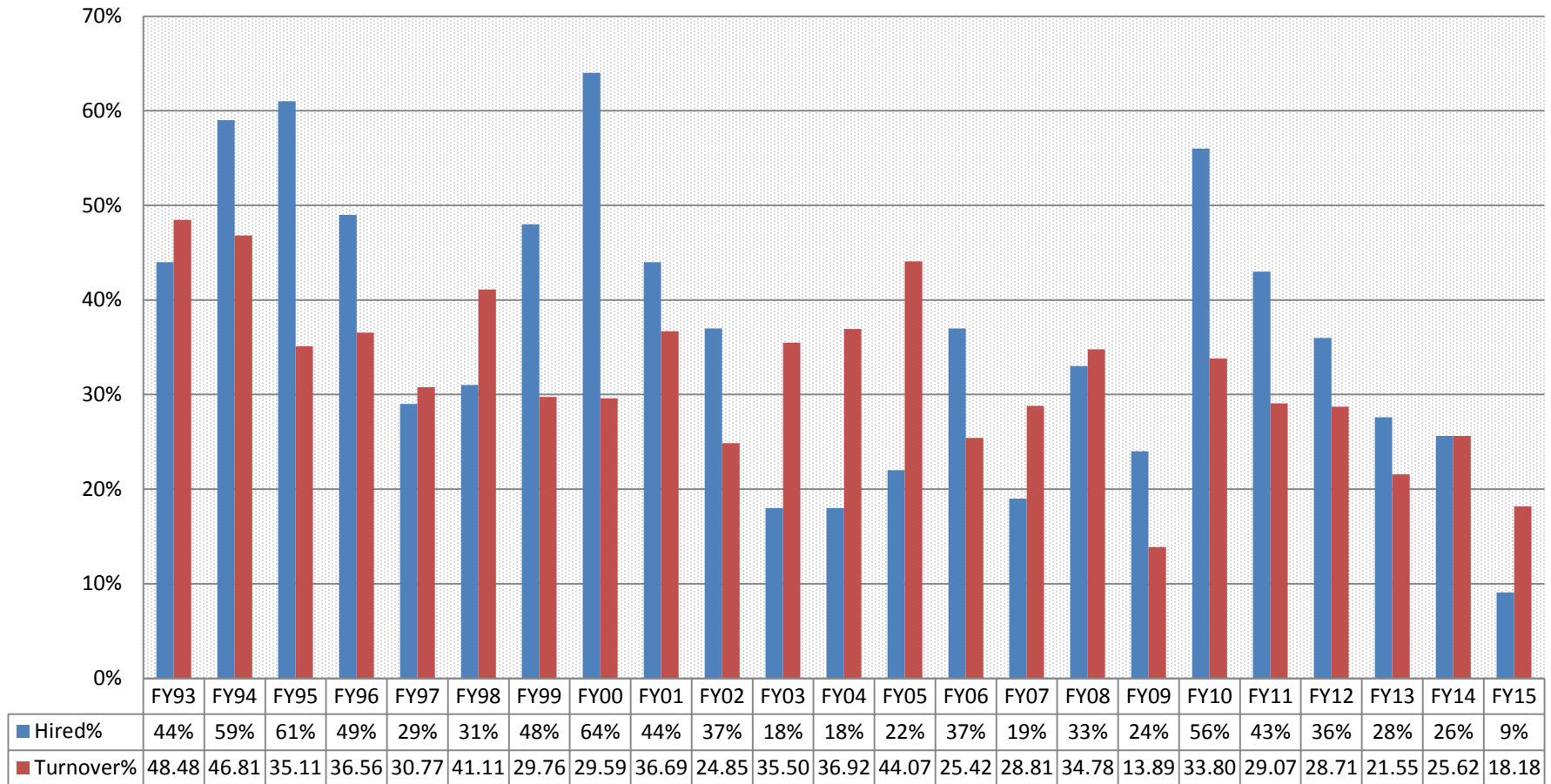

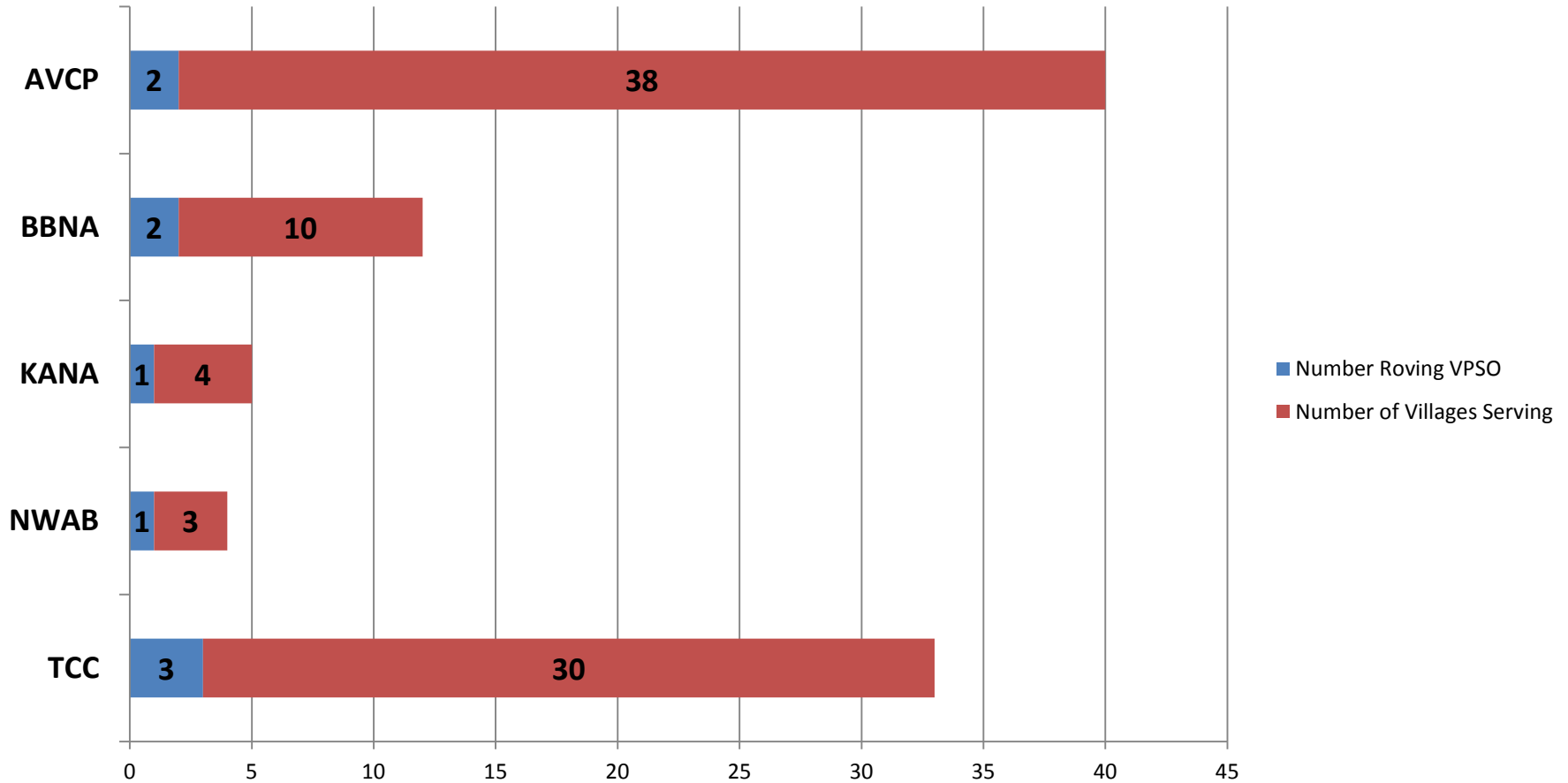

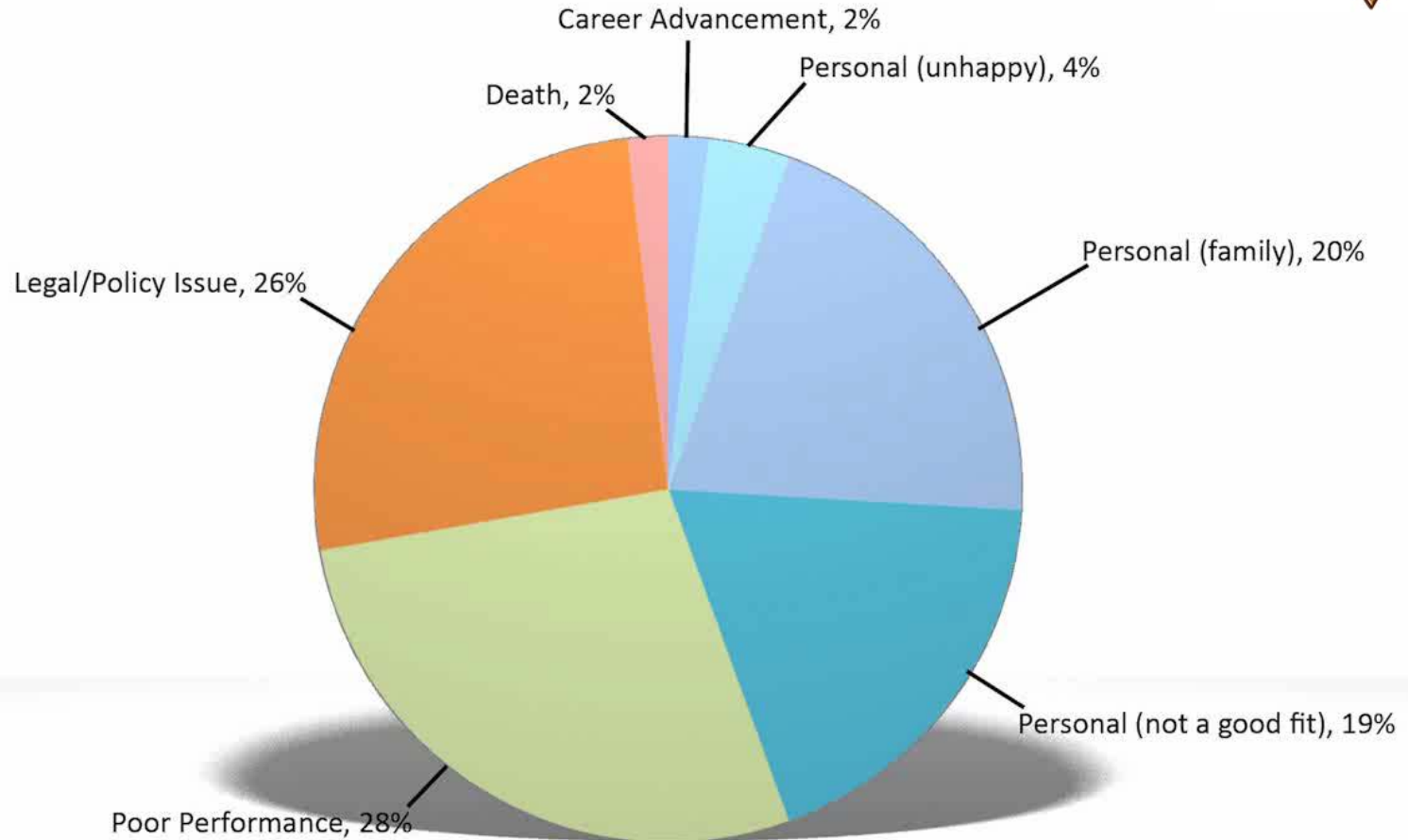

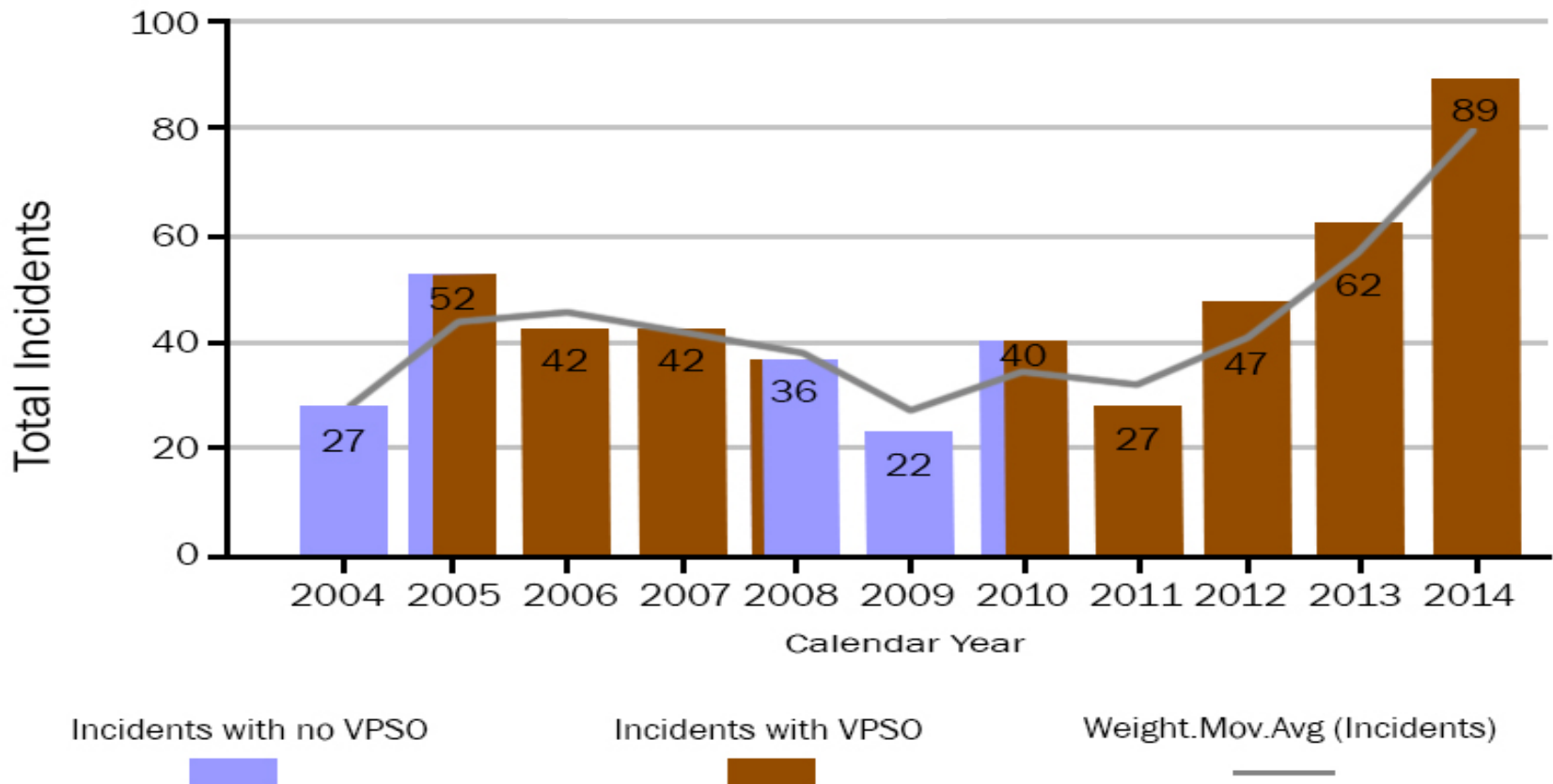

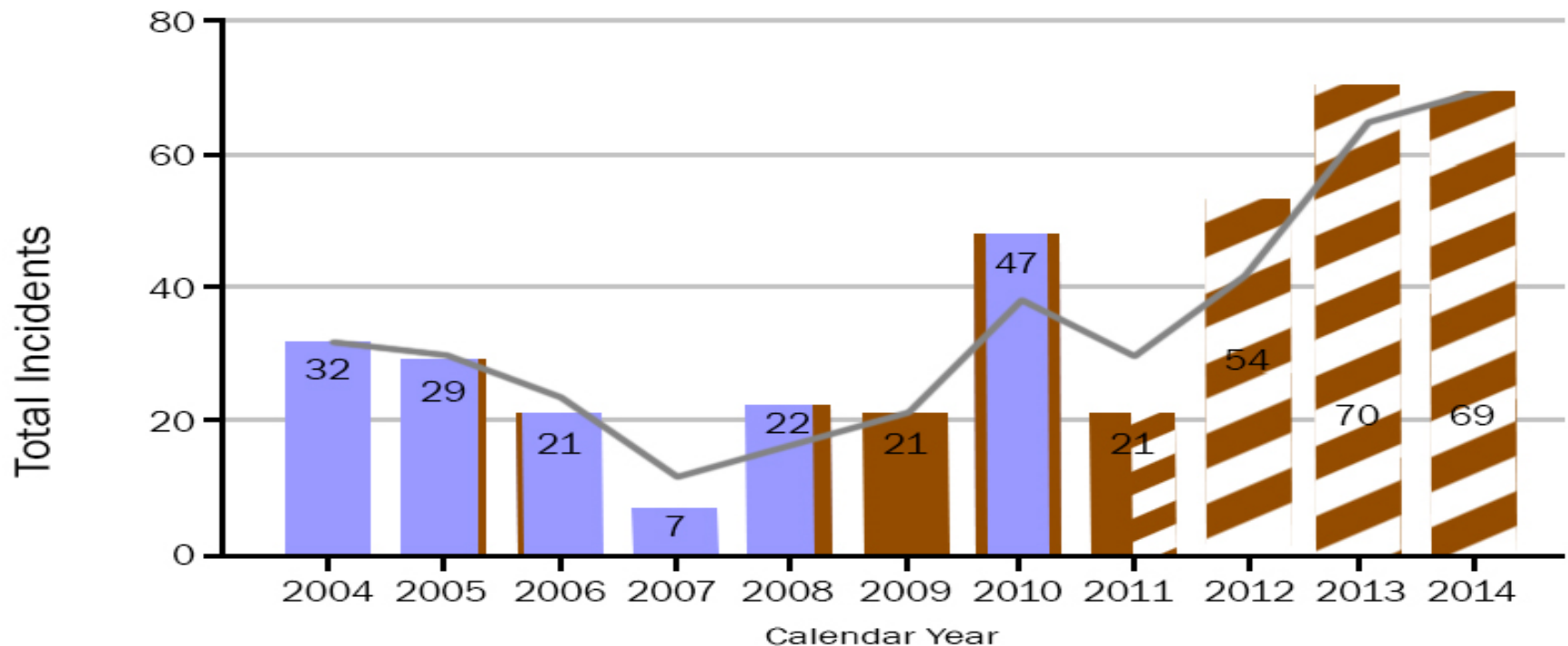

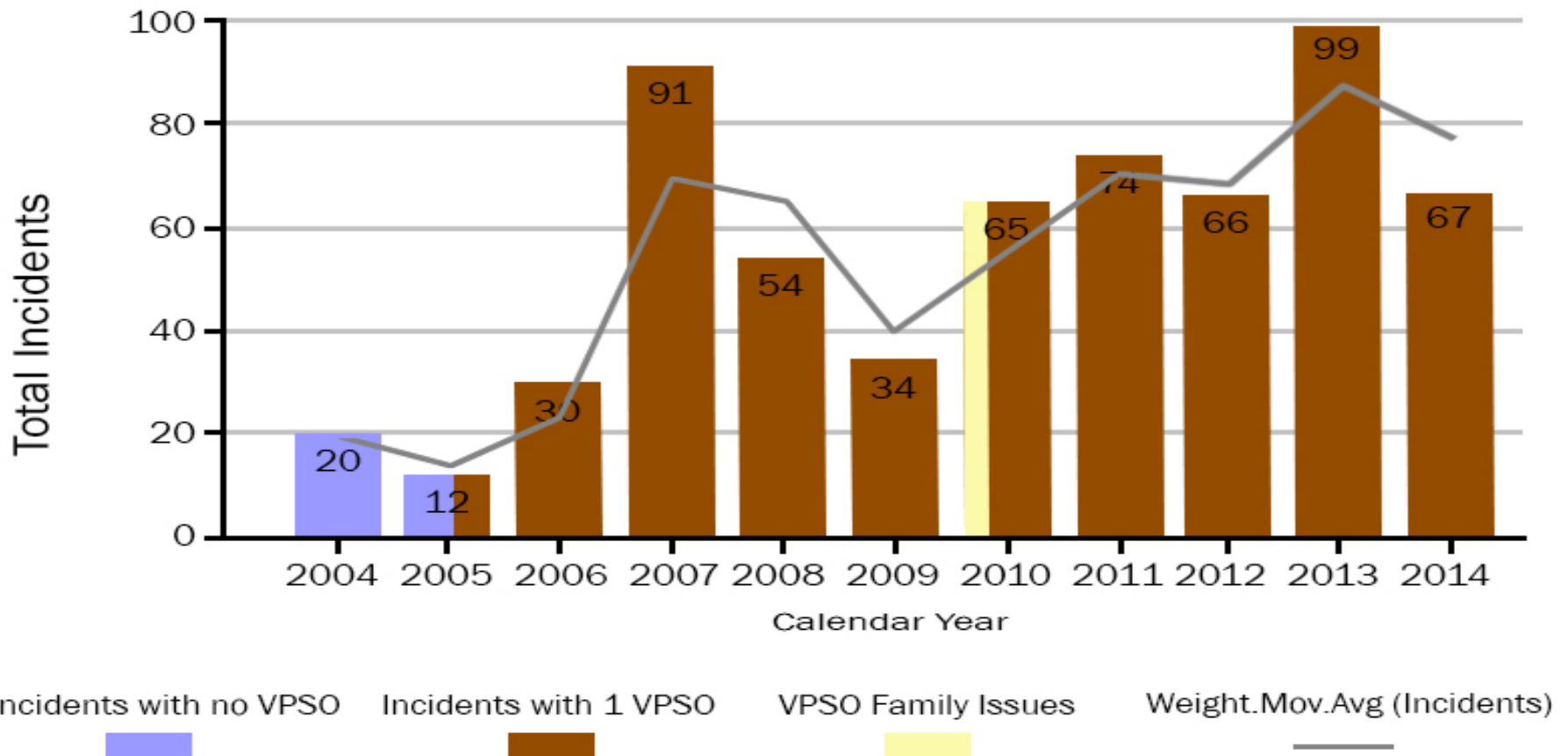

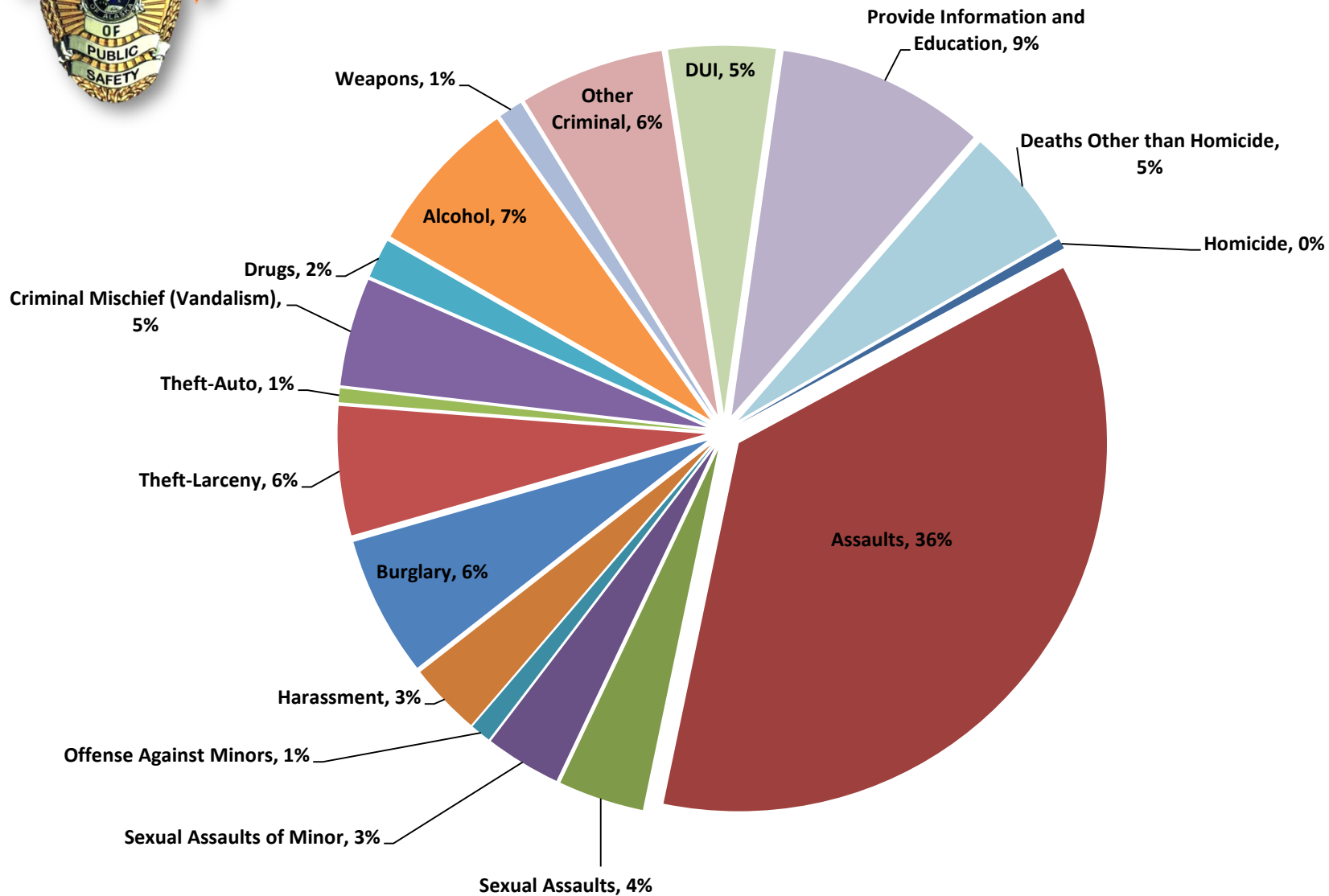
Village with Regular VPSO Coverage

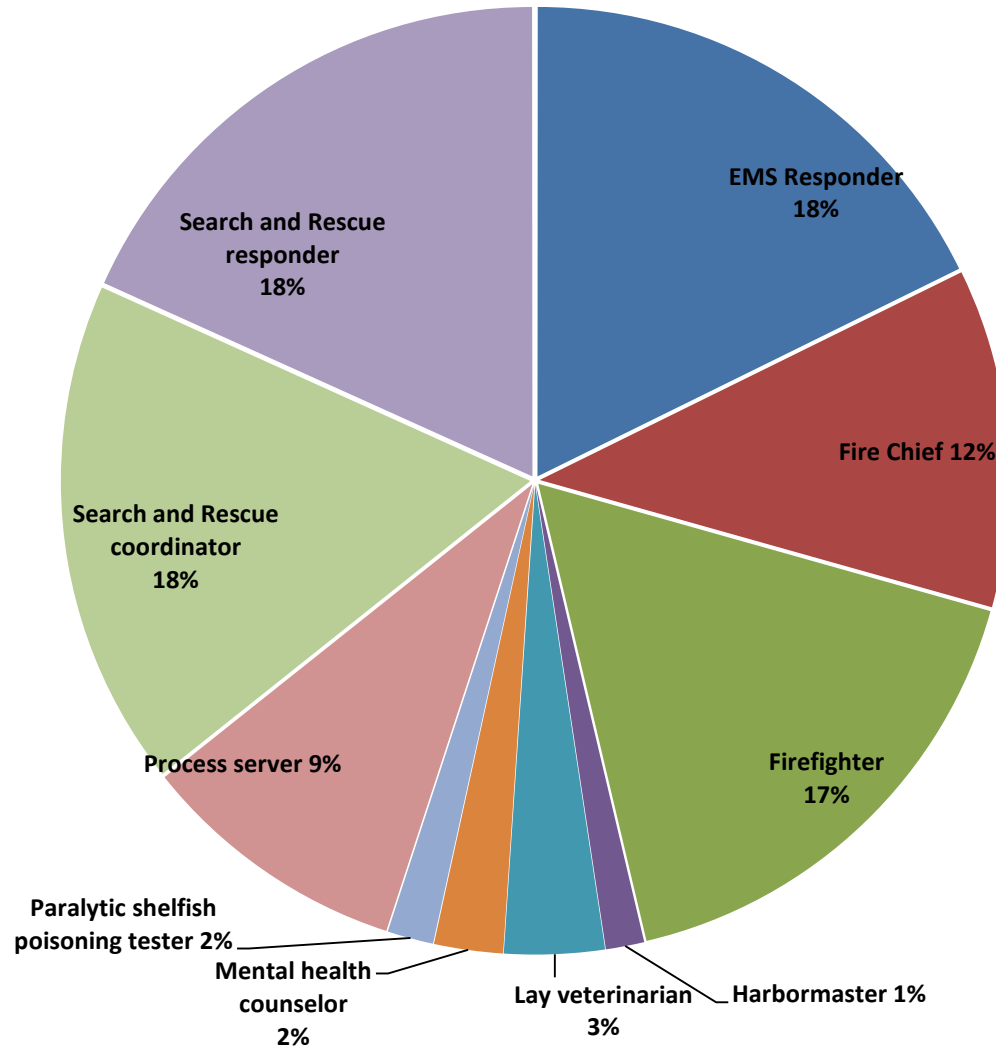

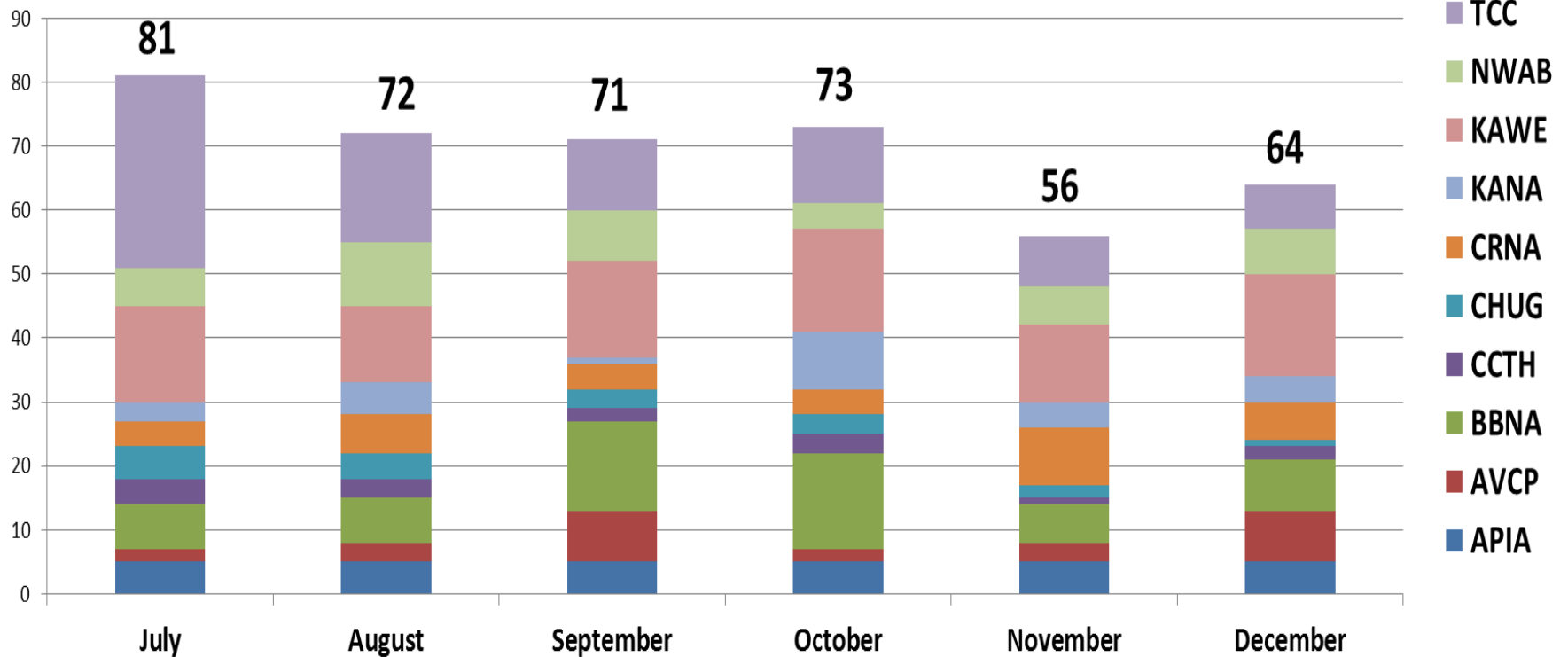

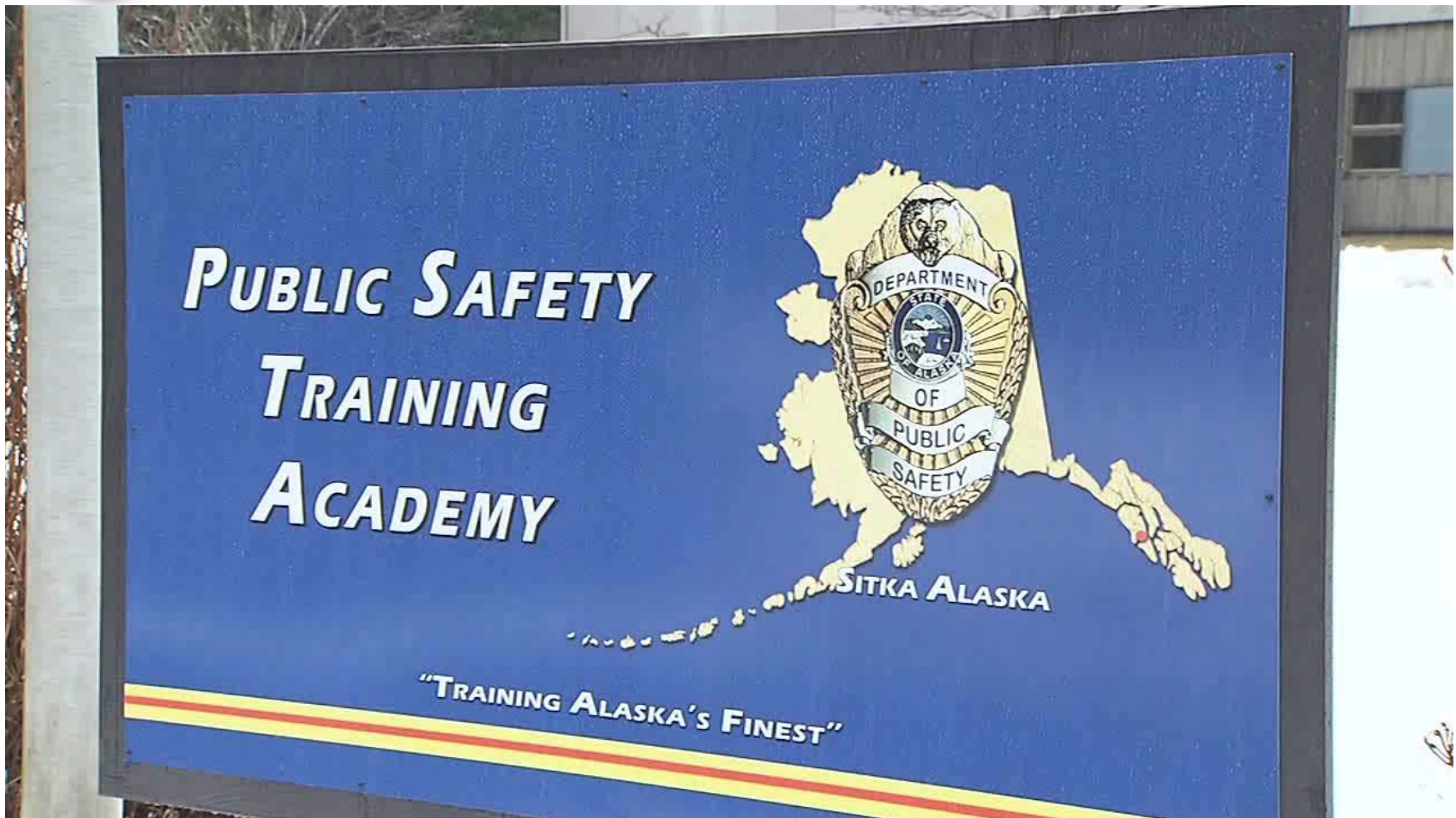

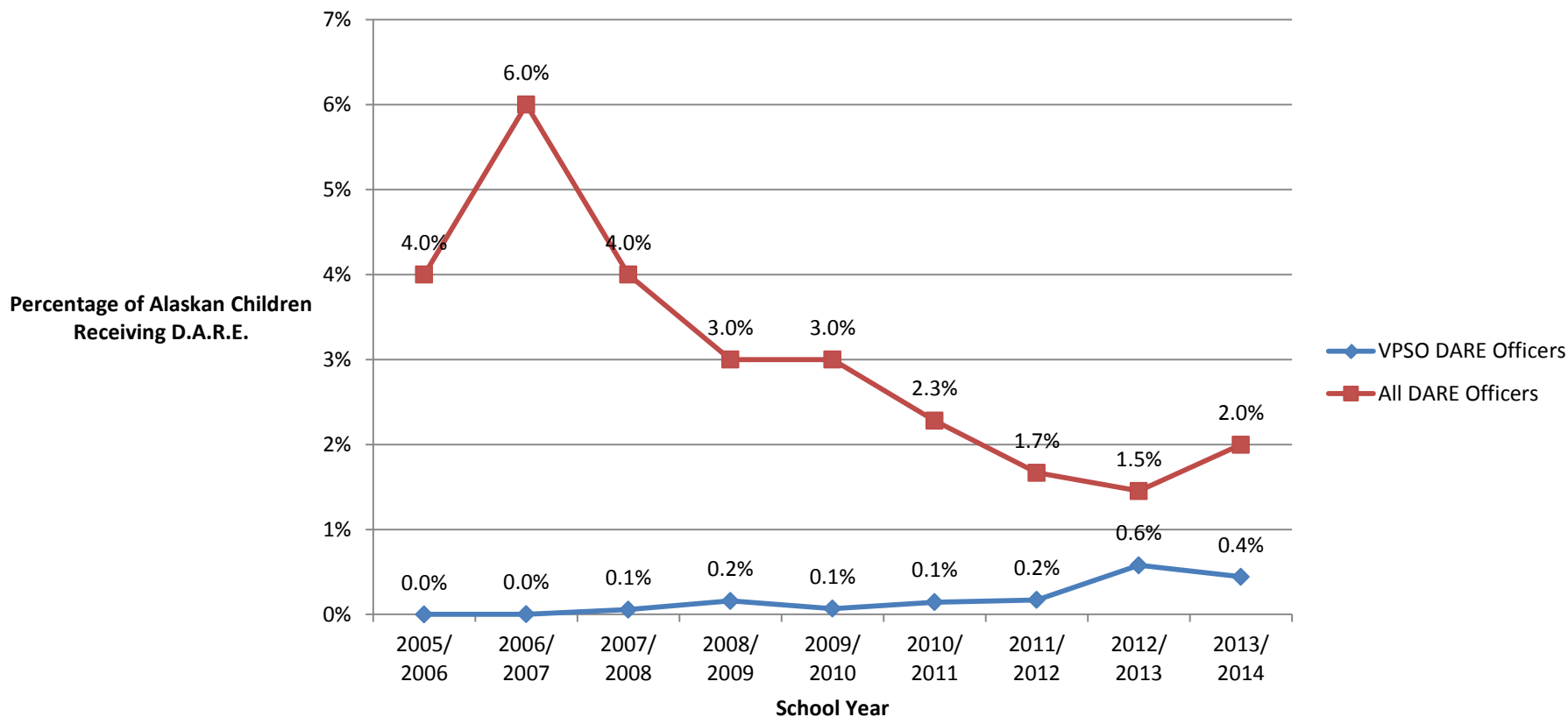




VPSO D.A.R.E. Program Statistics



% of Alaskan Children Receiving D.A.R.E. by a VPSO

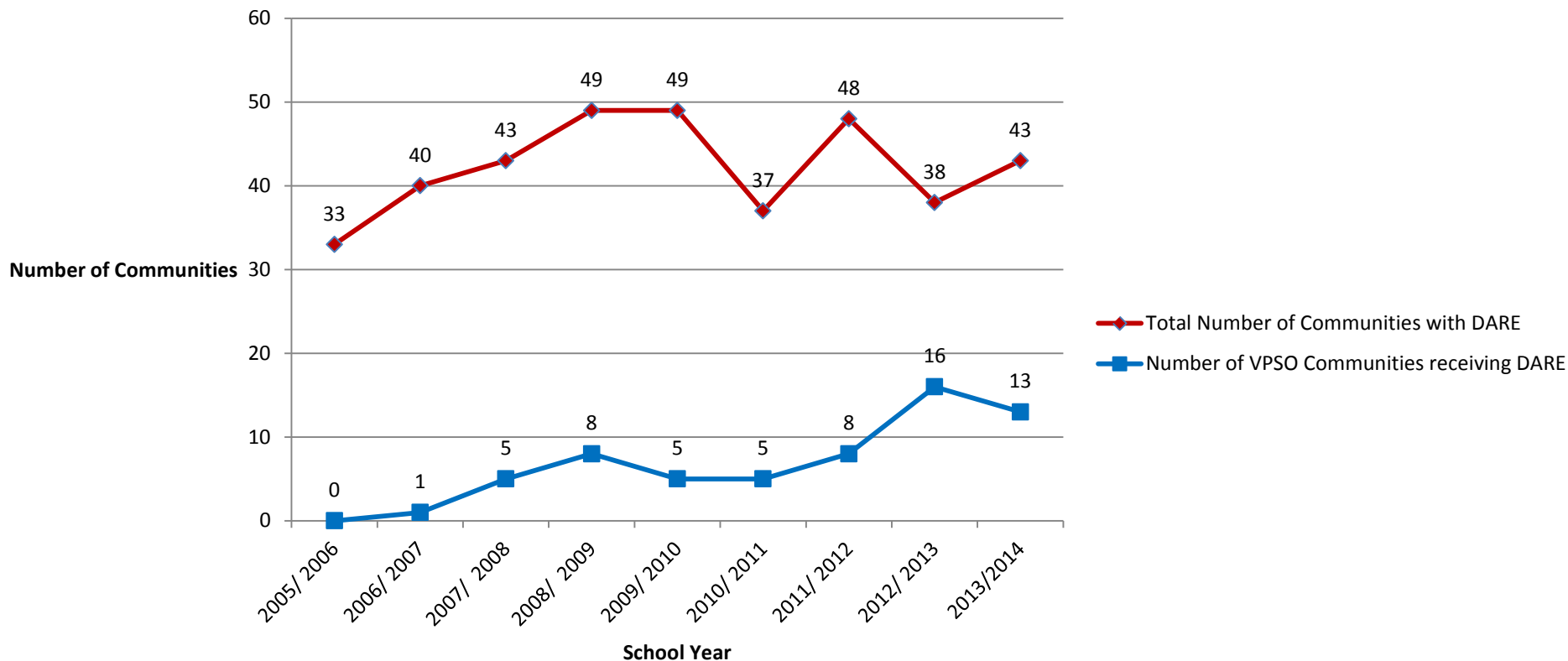




VPSO D.A.R.E. Community Statistics

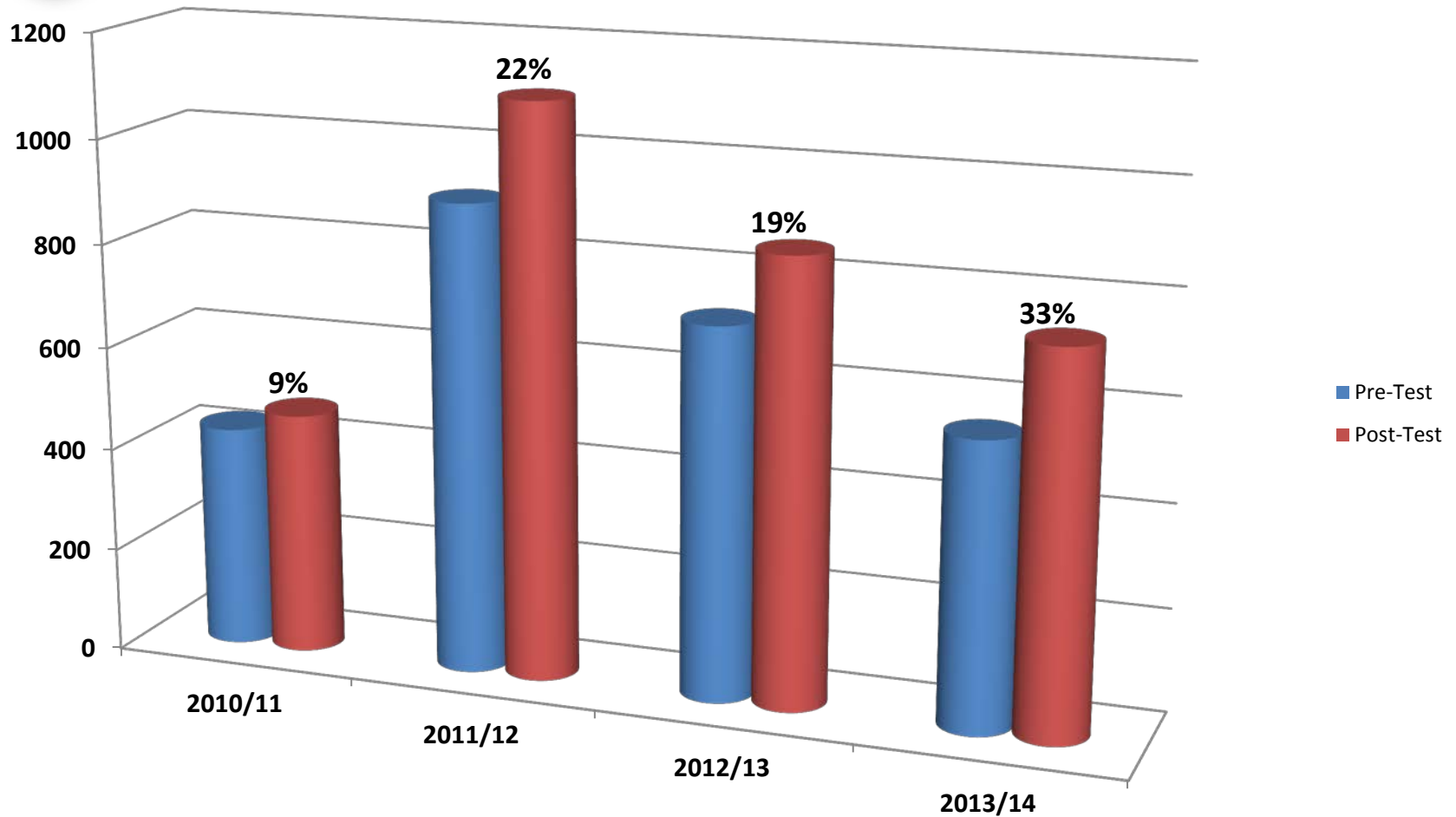


Number of Communities in Alaska receiving D.A.R.E. - VPSO Communities receiving D.A.R.E.
