Analysis

This legislation will allow credits toward sentence of imprisonment and good time for offenders placed on electronic monitoring, home arrest, or in a treatment program.
The department does not anticipate any fiscal impact with passage of this legislation as there was no decrease in the number of offenders participating in the electronic monitoring program when the elimination of good time occurred in SLA2007. However, if the number of offenders applying for electronic monitoring exceeds the current capacity for the program, the department may see a future increased need in resources. The department will continue to monitor this legislation for future impacts.
