
Ahtna, Incorporated TOLSONA GAS PROJECT REVIEW

- Ahtna requested an exploration licenses to explore on state land in 2012, Receiving in 2013.
- Ahtna Performed Seismic work in 2014-2015.
- Ahtna Permitting 2015-2016.
- Ahtna Drilling planned2016.




FRONTIER BASINS AHTNA EXPERIENCE

AHTNA'S VISION AND PROJECT GOALS:

Ahtna's Vision:

- Our Culture Unites Us; Our Land Sustains Us; Our People Are Prosperous
- Project goals that help achieve this vision:
 - + Affordable energy for local rural economy that will reduce costs.
 - + Create jobs in-region (including potential jobs to build supporting infrastructure & permanent jobs afterwards).
 - + Develop natural resources sustainably within the region, which will help to build up and expand the local community.
 - + Stop out-migration and support community growth.

- Proposed well depth of 4,500' Vertical hole.
- Targeted structure is the Nelchina sandstone.
- x 11 wells drilled in the basin since 1960's.
- Most resent well- Ahtna1-19. drilled 2005.
- Natural gas shows (approximately 94% methane).
- Potential for a great fuel source.

- Lowering High Energy Cost for our Rural Economy






Current Location






