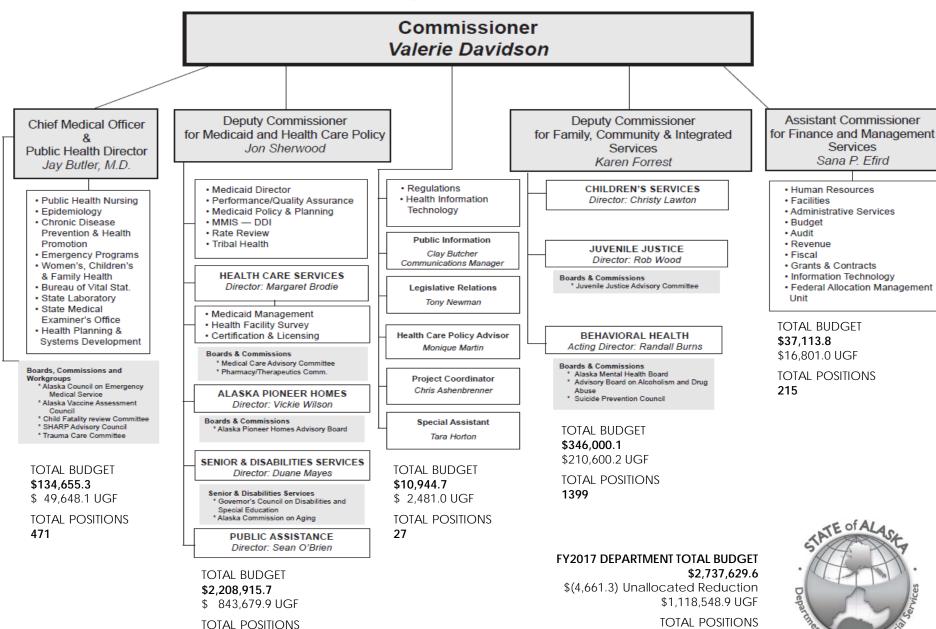

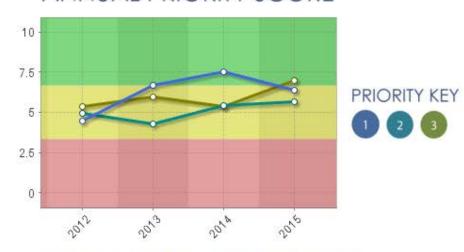

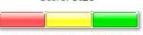

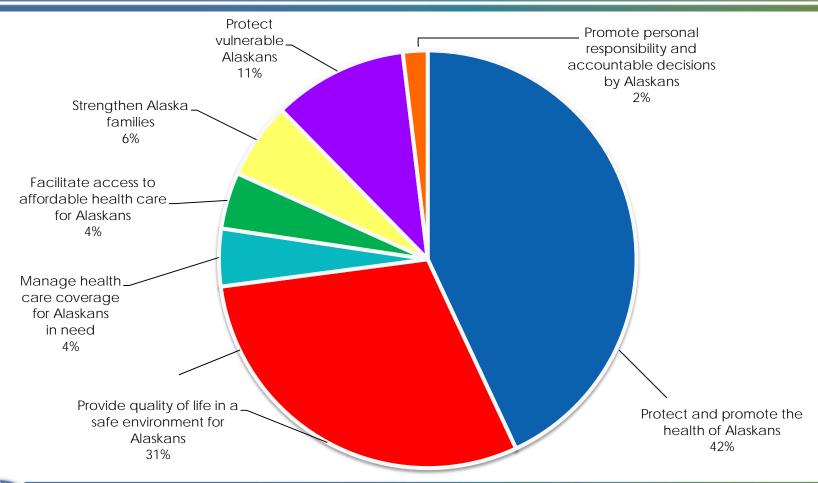

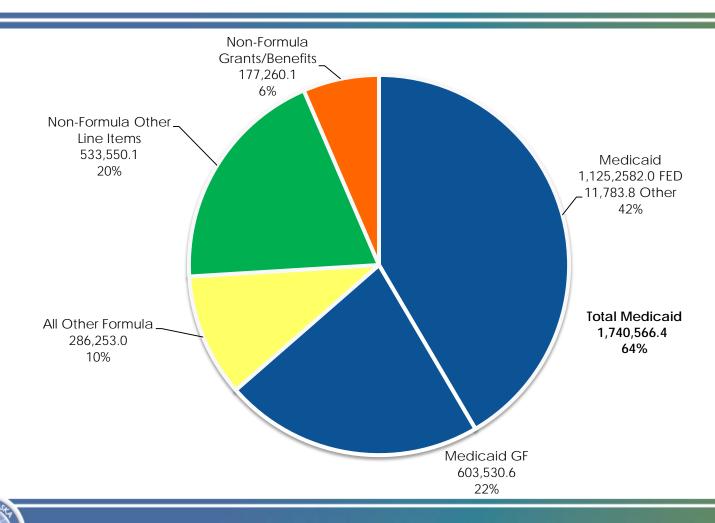
# DHSS FY2017 Governor's Budget Request Operating Budget by Core Services – All Funds

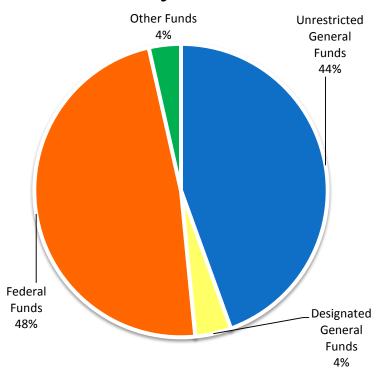

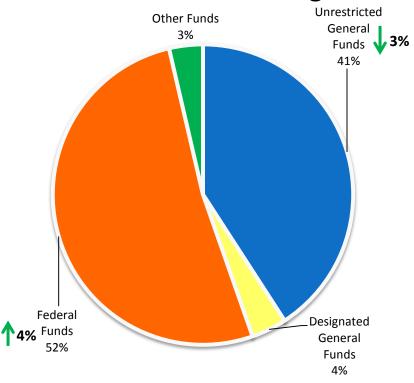

# Formula Programs

Formula Program - a program with specific eligibility standards tied to benefit levels for any recipient who qualifies. The eligibility standards and benefits must be based in statute and/or regulations.
