

Office of Children's Services Organization Chart






OCS Division Overview

- Total service population 11,469




Children in Placement







Efficiency Measures


What does it cost to provide services?




Current Challenges

- Impending Federal Audit in 2017




Did our intervention prevent additional maltreatment?
