





Historical Capital Budget Comparison






- Village Safe Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Projects
 - First Time Service Projects
 - Expansion, Upgrade, and Replacement of Existing Service
- \$42,250,000 Federal
- \$8,750,000 General Fund Match
- \$500,000 Statutory Designated Program Receipts



Rural Alaska Water & Sewer

State & Federal Funding for Village Safe Water



Funding for rural Alaska sanitation projects has declined by over \$61 Million, or 64% between 2004 and 2014.

- Reduced funding means making choices:
 - First time water and sewer service where feasible
 - Upgrades or replacement of existing systems to address significant health threats
 - Stretching limited funds
 - Prioritize for greatest need and biggest impact
 - Extend life with targeted improvements, limited scope



Alaska Water & Sewer Challenge

- Innovative international research and development effort
- Goal is to significantly reduce the capital and operating costs of in-home running water and sewer in rural Alaska homes
- Recently launched Phase 2
- Focus is on "Decentralized" approaches
 - Household based systems
 - Water re-use technologies
- To date \$4 million in State and Federal funds have been secured, but there may be a future request to support completion





- Municipal Water, Sewage, and Solid Waste Facilities Grants
 - Juneau Water Treatment Improvements, Phase II
 - Homer Water Storage and Distribution Improvements
 - North Pole Sewer Improvements, Phase II
 - Naknek Sewer Relocation and System Upgrade
- \$9,988,605 General Fund



Municipal Matching Grants

- Required community match
- Projects scored and ranked primarily based on the extent to which they address critical public health needs
- Grants are awarded in order to the highest ranking projects
- Established and well-respected process for evaluating and prioritizing the water, wastewater, and solid waste needs of Alaska's diverse communities
- Ensures there is no regional bias






- Drinking Water Capitalization Grant Subsidy Funding
- \$2,526,300 Alaska Drinking Water Loan Fund
- Federally required loan forgiveness



FY2015 Capital Appropriation Status Summary

- 295 total active DEC appropriations
 - Non-Facility Construction: 11
 - Village Safe Water: 180
 - Municipal Matching Grant: 104
- Down from 499 in FY2014
- Anticipate another 160-200 will be closed after this year
