FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HCR4

Analysis

HCR 4 calls for a countermand convention of the states. If HCR 4 passes and is agreed upon, it would require the Presiding Officers to appoint delegates to serve as representatives of the Legislature at the countermand amendment convention.

If HCR 4 is enacted, and after a total of 34 states place a call under Article V of the United States Constitution for a countermand convention, the Speaker of the House shall appoint three members and the President of the Senate shall appoint three members. The members would serve on the Delegate Credential Committee and would be required to meet during and between sessions and report back to the Legislature.

Because there are so many variables in this resolution and because the timeline is unknown, this fiscal note is indeterminate. Should this legislation pass and a countermand amendment convention be scheduled, an updated fiscal note will be required.
